DIRECTORS' REPORT

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES STATEMENT

The directors are responsible for preparing the annual report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to

- · Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- · Make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- State whether applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements, and
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregulanties.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

The company is a wholly owned subsiduary of MITIE Group PLC (the Group). The company provides installation of electrical and mechanical services in commercial and industrial premises. MITIE Engineering Services (Northern Region) Limited was hived up into MITIE Built Environment Limited on 1 December 2011.

As shown in the company's profit and loss account on page 8 the company sales have decreased by 25.5% pro rata during the eight months of trading. The profit after tax for the year was £349,000 compared to a loss after tax of £1,394,546 in the prior year. Financial performance shown is for the eight months to 30 November 2011. Comparative tumover is less than the previous year due to current economic conditions. The previous year's results included losses of MITIE Engineering Services Edinburgh which was hived up into MITIE Engineering Services (Northern Region) Limited in July 2010. Mitie Engineering Services (Northern Region) Limited's net liabilities were transferred to MITIE Built Environment Limited on 1 December 2011 for £1, realising a profit on sale of £584,020 which has been recognised as other operating income in the profit and loss account.

The Group manages its operations on a divisional basis. For this reason, the company's directors do not believe further key performance indicators are necessary for an appropriate understanding of the performance and position of the business. The performance of the Group's divisions is discussed in the Group's annual report which does not form part of this report.

Dividends for each share class were declared as follows ordinary shares. No Dividend.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Mitte Engineering Services (Northern Region) Limited is now hived up into MITIE Built Environment Limited. Group risks are discussed in the Group's annual report which does not form part of this report.

FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The directors have reviewed the financial risk management objectives and policies of the company. The directors do not believe there to be significant risks in this area. The company does not enter into any hedging instruments, as there are not believed to be any material exposures. It does not enter into any financial instruments for speculative purposes.

Appropriate trade terms are negotiated with suppliers and customers. Management reviews these terms and the relationships with suppliers and customers and manages any exposure on normal trade terms. The company prepares regular forecasts of cash flow and liquidity and any requirement for additional funding is managed as part of the overall MITIE Group PLC financing arrangements.

GOING CONCERN

As explained above, the company transferred its trade, assets and liabilities to MiTIE Built Environment Limited on 1 December 2011 and has ceased trading. As required by FRS 18 Accounting policies, the directors have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the company is no longer a going concern. No material adjustments arose as a result of ceasing to apply the going concern basis.

PAYMENT POLICY

The company's policy is to comply with the terms of payment agreed with a supplier. Where terms are not negotiated, the company endeavours to adhere with the supplier's standard terms. As at 31 March 2012, due to the transfer of going concern, this entity is no longer trading and as a result creditor days are nil in the current year (2011–131 days).

ENVIRONMENT

MITIE Group PLC and its subsidianes endeavour to identify, monitor and manage the impact of their activities on the environment and are fully committed to environmental accountability and protection. The company operates in accordance with Group policies, which are described in the Group's annual report which does not form part of this report.

EMPLOYEES

The company recognises the importance of good communications and employee relationships. In each company there is a relationship between the Chief Executive of MITIE Group PLC and individual employees in the company in these conditions, complex consultative procedures are seldom required to ensure that there is an understanding of the purpose of the business and the commercial realities of success. Employees are encouraged to become shareholders through the Sawings Related Share Option Scheme.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Year ended 31 March 2012

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted, which have been applied consistently throughout the current and the prior financial year, are described below.

Accounting convention

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention

Going concern

Details regarding the directors' consideration of going concern are given in the going concern section of the directors' report

Turnover

Turnover represents the total, excluding sales taxes, receivable in respect of goods and services supplied. All turnover anses within the United Kingdom, from the company's principal activity. Revenue is recognised as services are delivered.

Goodwill

Goodwill ansing on the acquisition of subsidiary undertakings and businesses, representing any excess of the fair value of the consideration given over the fair value of the identifiable assets and liabilities acquired, is capitalised and written off on a straight-line basis over its useful economic life, which is 20 years. Provision is made for any impairment

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset on a straight-line basis over its expected useful life, as follows

Fixtures and Fittings 3 to 10 years Motor Vehicles 3 years Short Leasehold Improvements 3 to 10 years

Operating leases

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged against income on a straight-line basis over the lease term

Long-term contracts

Amounts recoverable on long-term contracts, which are included in debtors, are stated at the net sales value of the work done less amounts receivable as progress payments on account. Excess progress payments are included in creditors as payments on account. Cumulative costs incurred net of amounts transferred to cost of sales, less provision for contingencies and anticipated future losses on contracts, are included as long-term contract balances in stock.

Profit is recognised on long-term contracts, if the final outcome can be assessed with reasonable certainty, by including in the profit and loss account turnover and related costs as contract activity progresses. Turnover is calculated as that proportion of the total contract value which costs incurred to date bear to total expected costs for that contract.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

Deferred tax is provided in full on timing differences that result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, at a future date, at rates expected to apply when they crystallise based on current tax rates and law. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the financial statements. Deferred tax is not provided on timing differences ansing from the revaluation of fixed assets where there is no commitment to sell the asset, or on unremitted earnings of subsidiaries and associates where there is no commitment to remit these earnings. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Pension costs

The company participates in the MITIE Group PLC Pension Schemes. One is a defined benefit multi-employer scheme, the assets and liabilities of which are held independently from the group. For the purposes of Financial Reporting Standard 17 ('Retirement Benefits'), the company has been unable to identify its share of the underlying assets and liabilities in the main group scheme on a consistent and reasonable basis. Therefore the company is accounting for contributions to the scheme as if it were a defined contribution scheme.

For defined contribution schemes, the amount charged to the profit and loss account is the contribution payable in the year

Share-based payments

The company participates in a number of MITIE Group PLC executive and employee share option schemes For all grants of share options, the fair value as at the date of grant is calculated using the Black-Scholes model and the corresponding expense is recognised on a straight-line basis over the vesting period based on the company's estimate of shares that will actually vest

Cash flow statement

The company has taken the exemption from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement, as it is included within the consolidated financial statements of MITIE Group PLC and greater than 90% of the voting rights of the company are held by MITIE Group PLC

Operating income

Operating income represents profit recognised on the sale of the business to MITIE Built Environment Limited

17 PENSION ARRANGEMENTS
