

Directors' report for the year ended 31 March 1997

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 1997.

Principal activities

The profit and loss account for the period is set out on page 5.

The principal activity of the company is the arrangement of the disposal of domestic and trade refuse.

Review of business

Both the level of business and the period end financial position were satisfactory. The directors expect that the present level of activity will be sustained for the foreseeable future.

Dividends and transfers to reserves

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend. The profit for the financial year of £24,213 will be transferred to reserves.

The directors of the company at 31 March 1997, all of whom have been directors for the whole of the year ended on that date, are listed on page 1.

Mr I Wakelin resigned as a director on 22 July 1997.

Directors' interests in shares of the company

No directors held beneficial interests in the shares of the company at 31 March 1997, or at any time during the year.

Changes in fixed assets

The company does not own any fixed assets.

Close company provisions

The company is not a close company as defined by the provisions of the Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988.

Directors' responsibilities

The directors are required by UK company law to prepare financial statements for each financial year that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company as at the end of the financial year and of the profit or loss of the company for that period.

The directors confirm that suitable accounting policies have been used and applied consistently and reasonable and prudent judgements and estimates have been made in the preparation of the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 1997. The directors also confirm that applicable accounting standards have been followed and that the financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records, for taking reasonable steps to safeguard the assets of the company and to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 1997

1 Parent undertaking

Greater Manchester Waste Limited is the immediate parent of the company. The financial statements of the company are included in the financial statements of Greater Manchester Waste Limited. Greater Manchester Waste Disposal Authority is the ultimate parent undertaking.

2 Principal accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom. A summary of the more important accounting policies, which have been applied consistently, is set out below.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention.

Cash flow

No cash flow statement has been prepared as Greater Manchester Waste Limited, the immediate parent company, is preparing consolidated financial statements including a consolidated cash flow statement.

Turnover

Turnover includes landfill tax, but excludes value added tax, and comprises charges made for the disposal of trade and domestic waste.

Deferred taxation

Tax deferred, or accelerated, is accounted for in respect of all material timing differences to the extent that it is probable that a liability or asset will crystallise.

3 Turnover and profit on ordinary activities before taxation

Turnover consists entirely of sales made in the United Kingdom.

4 Directors' emoluments

The directors received no emoluments during the year (1996: £Nil).
