DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 31ST AUGUST 2004

OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY, PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND ORGANISATION OF OUR WORK

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee, and is therefore governed by a memorandum and articles of association. Its income and property may only be applied towards the promotion of its objects.

The charity's object and it's principal activity continues to be that of providing assistance to the children and young people of the London Borough of Southwark and in the area of South East London generally by the promotion, maintenance, advancement and improvement of education, by the relief of poverty, and by the provision in the interests of social welfare of facilities for children and young people.

The charity continues to explore new ways of improving opportunities for children and young people.

There have been no changes in our policies since our last report.

The charity is organised so that the trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs. The Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer undertake the day to day administration on a voluntary basis and the charity would be unable to operate without the help of many unpaid volunteers.

DEVELOPMENT, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS THIS YEAR

The trustees consider that the performance of the charity this year has been most satisfactory.

The whole ethos of the Southwark Children's Foundation (SCF) is to overcome the effects of poverty and disadvantage, which deprive children and young people experiences available to other children. SCF aims to positively promote children's and young people's quality of life and life prospects through its services.

Poverty affects parents and carers opportunities to provide experiences for their children beyond the essential day to day needs. The SCF aims to support and empower parents and carers to meets their children's needs. The disadvantage of generations of poverty in a poor community limits parents and carers own experiences. There can be a lack of incentive to get involved in creative arts, sports and leisure activities, or to seek out and visit places of interest even when there may be disposable income available after essential needs are met. The Charity's funding is low but we have been given assurances of funding to cover three years operation and are confidently seeking funding to employ a development officer for a similar period.

DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 31ST AUGUST 2004 (continued)

<u>The Artists, Authors and Artefacts Project</u>. The project was suspended this year. Plans are in progress to consider setting up workshops for children on Saturdays if venues can be found at low cost.

The Saturday Primary Brass Band. The high standard of playing and performing continues with free tuition for over 60 children attending each session. The young musicians, aged between 6 and 12 years are taught by inspired tutors led by Musical Director, Fred Greenhill. The standard of playing is very accomplished and the Band performed in a concert with adult bands and ensembles arranged by Trinity College of Music at Blackheath Concert Hall in July 2004.

TRANSACTIONS AND FINANCIAL POSITION

The Statement of Financial Activities shows a net income deficit of £15,550 for the year and our reserves stand at £7,566. Note 2 to the accounts summarise the results of the project.

DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES

All Directors of the company as listed on page 1 are also trustees of the charity and there are no other trustees.

- prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees' are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

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NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST AUGUST 2004

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the charity's operations which are described in the Report of the Directors and Trustees and all of which are continuing.

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with Statement of Recommended Practice on Charity Accounts.

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

(b) Income and expenditure

Income and expenditure are on accruals basis and allocated to the projects to which they relate.

(c) Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation.

Depreciation is provided in equal amounts each year to write off the cost of fixed assets over their anticipated useful lives. Estimated useful lives are:

Equipment 4 years

Improvements to and equipment for short leasehold property are written off when incurred.

(d) Gifts in Kind

Gifts in Kind are not reflected in the financial statements.

(e) Going concern
