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LTA Ground Limited Directors' report

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2009.

Principal activity

The company's principal activity was formerly to own and manage properties used by entities within the Lawn Tennis Association group. Following the sale of Queen's Club in 2007, the only significant item remaining within LTA Ground is prepaid court time for Queenswood School, which is being utilised on an annual basis.

Review of business

Both the level of business and the year end position were satisfactory. There are no significant financial risks facing the company.

Results and dividends

The profit for the year was £3,346 (2008: £6,042) and the directors recommend that no dividend is paid this year (2008: £nil). The retained profit, has, therefore, been transferred to reserves.

Notes to the financial statements

For the year ended 30 September 2009

1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

These financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards. The principal accounting policies are set out below.

Taxation including deferred tax

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted by the balance sheet date.

Provision for deferred tax is made in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed, by the balance sheet date. The provision for deferred tax is not discounted. Deferred tax assets are only recognised to the extent that it is regarded that they will be recovered.

Operating lease rentals received

Rentals received under operating leases are charged to income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

Cash flow statement and related party disclosure exemptions

The company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Lawn Tennis Association and is included in the group financial statements of the Lawn Tennis Association, which are publicly available. Consequently, the company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 1.

The company is also exempt under Financial Reporting Standard 8 from disclosing related party transactions with entities that are part of the Lawn Tennis Association group.
