Auditors' Report to Relectronic-Remech Ltd pursuant to Paragraph 24 of Schedule 8 to the Companies Act 1985

We have examined the abbreviated accounts on pages 3 to 6, together with the full accounts of Relectronic-Remech Ltd, prepared under section 226 of the Companies Act 1985, for the year ended 30th September 1995.

Respective responsibilities of directors and auditors

The directors are responsible for preparing abbreviated accounts in accordance with Schedule 8 to the Companies Act 1985. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion as to the company's entitlement to the exemptions claimed in the directors' statement on page 3 and whether the abbreviated accounts have been properly prepared in accordance with that Schedule.

Basis of opinion

Notes to the accounts

1. Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been used consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's accounts.

Accounting Convention

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided using the following rates and bases which reflect the anticipated useful lives of the assets and their residual value:

Office and workshop equipment Office furniture and fittings Workshop fixtures and fittings Vehicles

20% Straight line 33.3% Straight line 20% Straight line 20% Straight line

Leasehold improvements

Equal installments over the lease term

*Profits or losses arising on the disposal of fixed assets are adjusted in the depreciation charge for the year.

Finance Leases

Assets held under finance leases are included under fixed assets at their fair value. The assets are depreciated over their useful lives. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability and the interest element is charged to the profit and loss account.

Operating Leases

Rentals applicable to operating leases, where substantially all the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor, are charged against profits as incurred.

Pension Costs

Contributions in respect of the company's defined contribution pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the year in which they are payable to the scheme.

Foreign Currency Translation

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. Money assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rate applying at the balance sheet date. Differences are taken to the profit and loss account.

Notes to the accounts

1. Accounting Policies (Continued)

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Work in progress is valued at the lower of:

- (i) Direct cost and the attributable proportion of all overheads appropriate to location and condition.
- (ii) Net realisable value.

Deferred Taxation

Provision is made for deferred taxation, using the liability method, to take account of timing differences between the incidence of income and expenditure for taxation and accounting purposes, except to the extent that the directors do not consider that the liability will crystallize.

Cash Flow Statement

The accounts do not include a cash flow statement because the company, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under Financial Reporting Standard 1.

Compliance with Accounting Standards

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards.
