Report of the Directors

The Directors have pleasure in presenting their report and financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2009

Principal activities, review of business and future developments

The principal activity of the company throughout the year was the provision of specialist environmental services to the waste management and environmental sectors under the trading name of enitial

Sales overall were higher than the previous year due to new contracts becoming operational during the year. There was some sales contraction from existing contracts due to customers reducing requirements which had an adverse impact on margins. Month on month profits showed an upward trend from the second quarter of the year.

Profits and cash flow since the year end have been in line with budget, working capital and net debt are both improved. The full year operating profit is expected to show a marked increase over the previous year.

The company has on-going repeat activity business with public bodies and medium-term contracts with other customers required to comply with environmental legislation. As a consequence the Directors believe the company is well placed to manage its business risks successfully despite the uncertain economic outlook.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2009

1. Accounting policies

a) Accounting basis and standards

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

b) Going concern

The company had net current liabilities of £39,080 (2008 £361,932) at the balance sheet date. The company is dependent upon the continuing financial support of its bankers who have indicated that they will continue with this support. Given the continuation of this support, the Directors are satisfied that the financial statements can be prepared on a going concern basis.

c) Consolidated financial statements

The company is exempt from the requirements to prepare consolidated financial statements by virtue of the Companies Act 2006 as the group it heads qualifies as a small group. These financial statements therefore present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

d) Cash flow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption conferred by Financial Reporting Standard 1 'Cash Flow Statements (Revised 1996)' not to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a 'small' company under the Companies Act 2006

e) Depreciation

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided at rates estimated to write off the cost or revalued amounts, less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life as follows

Freehold buildings 2% straight line p a
Plant and equipment 10% - 25% straight line p a
Motor vehicles 25% straight line p a

f) Leased assets

Where assets are financed by leasing agreements that give rights approximating to ownership (finance leases), the assets are treated as if they had been purchased outright. The amount capitalised is the present value of the minimum lease payments payable during the lease term. The corresponding leasing commitments are shown as amounts payable to the lessor. Depreciation on the relevant assets is charged to the profit and loss account.

Lease payments are analysed between capital and interest components. The interest element of the payment is charged to the profit and loss account over the period of the lease and is calculated so that it represents a constant proportion of the balance of capital repayments outstanding. The capital part reduces the amounts payable to the lessor

All other leases are treated as operating leases. Their annual rentals are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

g) Turnover

Turnover represents the invoiced value of goods and services provided net of value added tax

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2009 (continued..)

h) Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is based on the cost of purchase on a first in, first out basis. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less additional costs to completion and disposal. Work in progress includes labour and attributable overheads.

Work in progress is assessed on a contract basis and is reflected in the profit and loss account by recording turnover and related costs as contract activity progresses. Where the outcome of the contract can be assessed with reasonable certainty before its conclusion, the attributable profit is recognised in the profit and loss account as the difference between reported turnover and related costs for that contract

r) Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation, on losses, accelerated capital allowances and other timing differences, is calculated on the liability method, and is provided to the extent that an asset is expected to become recoverable or a liability is expected to become payable in the foreseeable future

Pension costs

Contributions to the company's defined contribution pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the period in which they become payable

2 Turnover

Turnover is wholly attributable to the one principal activity of the company which arose in the United Kingdom
