

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The directors submit their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 1995.

ACTIVITIES

The company continued its operation of a golf course.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The trading surplus for the year was £15,784 (1994 - £21,982) and in accordance with the Deed of Covenant with the parent company, the National Council of YMCAs (Incorporated), this sum has been donated to that company giving an overall nil result for the year.

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend for the year (1994 - £Nil).

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS AND FUTURE PROSPECTS

The trading profit before covenanted donations is considered a satisfactory result for the year. The directors of the company are of the opinion that future prospects are satisfactory.

The directors who held office during the year ended 31 March 1995 were as shown on page 2.

DIRECTORS' INTERESTS

Dr J C G Binfield held one ordinary £1 share throughout the year. No other director serving at the end of the year had any interests in the shares of the company at any time during the year.

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

AUDITORS

A resolution to re-appoint Dixon Wilson as auditors of the company in accordance with Section 385 of the Companies Act 1985 will be proposed at the forthcoming annual general meeting.

SPECIAL EXEMPTIONS
