NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

1. Accounting Policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

1.2 Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The company has incurred losses before discretionary subsidy funding in the current and prior year and is dependent upon its ultimate parent for funding. While the director expects the company to achieve profitability in the near future, the company will remain dependent upon this funding until such a time as it has generated enough cash through profitable trading to enable it to meet its liabilities as and when they fall due. The ultimate parent company has confirmed to the director their current intention to continue to provide this subsidy funding to enable the company to meet its liabilities as they fall due for the foreseeable future, and the director has therefore prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis.

1.3 Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of goods and services supplied during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts.

1.4 Intangible fixed assets and amortisation

Goodwill is the difference between amounts paid on the acquisition of a business and the fair value of the identifiable assets and liabilities. It is amortised to the Profit and Loss Account over its estimated economic life.

1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

1.6 Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the Profit and Loss Account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

Benefits received and receivable as an incentive to sign an operating lease are recognised on a straight line basis over the period until the date the rent is expected to be adjusted to the prevailing market rate.

1. Accounting Policies (continued)

1.7 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation.

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

1.8 Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date.

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate ruling on the date of the transaction.

Exchange gains and losses are recognised in the Profit and Loss Account.

2. Turnover

100.0% of the company's turnover (2014 - 100.0%) is attributable to geographical markets outside the United Kingdom.

Factors that may affect future tax charges

The UK corporation tax rate decreased from 21% to 20% from 1 April 2015.

Further reductions to the UK corporation tax rate have been announced that will have an effect on future tax charges. Further reductions in the rate to 19% from 1 April 2017 and 18% from 1 April 2020 had been enacted at the balance sheet date. A further reduction to 17% from 1 April 2020 had not been enacted at the balance sheet date.

The company has trading losses carried forward of £630,042 (2014: £1,108,164). No deferred tax asset has been recognised due to uncertainty over future taxable profits.
