1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the Company's financial statements

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost accounting rules

In accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 1, the Company is exempt from the requirement to present a cash flow statement on the grounds that a parent undertaking includes the Company in its own published consolidated financial statements

As the Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of the group headed by the Sumitomo Corporation, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with entities which form part of the group (or investees of the group qualifying as related parties) The consolidated financial statements of the Sumitomo Corporation, within which the Company is included, can be obtained from the address given in note 20

Turnover

Turnover represents the amount (excluding value added tax) derived from the provision of goods and services to customers during the year

Taxation

Corporation tax payable is provided on taxable profits at the current rate. Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS19

Dividends

Dividends are only recognised as a liability to the extent that they are declared prior to the year end Unpaid dividends that do not meet these criteria are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements

Fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided by the Company to write off the cost less the estimated residual value of tangible fixed assets by equal instalments over their estimated useful economic lives as follows

Plant and machinery - 4 - 20 years
Fixtures & fittings - 4 - 20 years

Motor vehicles - 4 - 10 years

Office equipment - 4 - 20 years

Pension costs

The Company offers a Group Personal Pension Plan to its employees
The amount charged against profits represents the contributions payable to the scheme in respect of the accounting period

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value, provision having been made for any slow moving or obsolete stock where this is considered necessary. Cost is determined on a last price paid basis

A reduction in the UK corporation tax rate from 26% to 25% (effective from 1 April 2012) was substantively enacted on 5 July 2011, and further reductions to 24% (effective from 1 April 2012) and 23% (effective from 1 April 2013) were substantively enacted on 26 March 2012 and 3 July 2012 respectively. This will reduce the Company's future current tax charge accordingly. The deferred tax liability at 31 March 2013 has been calculated based on the rate of 23% substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

The March 2013 Budget announced that the rate will further reduce to 20% by 2015 in addition to the planned reduction to 21% by 2014 previously announced in the December 2012 Autumn Statement. It has not yet been possible to quantify the full anticipated effect of the announced further 3% rate reduction, although this will further reduce the Company's future current tax charge and reduce the Company's deferred tax asset accordingly
