(1)	Principal Activity:	To promote the welfare of elderly people in a charitable manner within the Metropolitan Borough of St Helens.
(2)	Review of Operations:	The company continued to operate their four charity shops throughout the year. Nine day centres operated throughout the year whilst the Haven Centre closed in December 1994. The Mansion House also became fully operational. Age Concern Trading Ltd, a new trading company, also began to operate at the beginning of the year and took over the trading activities previously associated with the company.
(3)	Directors:	The Directors who have served during the year are as listed on page 1. The Directors do not receive any remuneration for their services.
(4)	Fixed Assets:	Changes in Fixed Assets arose out of normal requirements.
(5)	Future Capital Commitments:	Future capital costs include fencing and other commitments at the Mansion House plus structural alterations at Claughton Street premises which will amount in aggregate to approximately £43,000.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1995

(1) ACCOUNTING POLICIES: Basis of Accounting:

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Tangible Fixed Assets:

(a) Premises at 24/28 Claughton Street cost £44,715 and were professionally valued in July 1990 at £120,000. In the circumstances it is not deemed necessary to make any provision for depreciation on these premises.

The Sutton shop premises at the Peckers Hill Road were purchased by the Haven Trust for £18,000 for the beneficial use of Age Concern St Helens. The Deeds to these premises are to be gifted into the name of Age Concern St Helens Ltd as soon as expedient.

The premises at 27 Market Street, Newton are rented and the subject of a lease until 2001 with five year rent reviews the next being in November 1996.

The Thatto Heath shop premises at 6 Elephant Lane were the subject of a six year lease with effect from 1 June 1993 with a rent review after 3 years.

The Mansion House in Victoria Park was purchased in April 1993 and major building alteration and renovation work was finally completed during the year when the building became fully operational. The cost has been mainly funded by the Pilkington Charities Trust and the cost is shown at £1,532,752. Additional costs are still to be incurred for fencing and other items. A recent professional reinstatement valuation for insurance purposes carried out by C J Brown, Chartered Surveyor shows a valuation of £2,206,424. In the circumstances whilst it is still prudent to provide for depreciation it is considered that a straight line method of 1% of the original cost should now be adopted for this and future years.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1995

(b) Other Fixed Assets:

Depreciation is provided at the following rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

- (i) Motor Vehicles straight line method over 5 years
- (ii) Equipment straight line method over 4 years
- (iii) Furniture, Fixtures and Fittings straight line method over 3 years

Stocks:

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(2) EMPLOYEES:

The average weekly number of employees during the year was 17 (1994 - 17).
