REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Trustees present their report and the audited accounts of the charity for the year ended 31st July 1997.

Principal Activity

The principal activity of the charity is to provide tuition and facilities to selected youngsters who show potential in golf and tennis.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

Company law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the surplus/deficit of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees are required to:-

- (i) select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- (ii) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- (iii) prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue to operate.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Review of the Company's Activities

In the past twelve months the scholarship has continued to develop, with the emphasis continuing on the selection of youngsters who would not otherwise have the opportunity to benefit from the quality of coaching and facilities available at Wentworth.

At the end of the period, eleven golfers and six tennis players were in the Scheme.

Golf: the young golfers are encouraged to play and practice as much as possible. Regular group coaching and a schedule of competitions, particularly in the school holidays, form the basis of the structured annual programme.

Achievements include: Jason Kelly won the Club Junior Championship with Sam Osbourne finishing as runner-up. All the scholars played with distinction, with Ross Fisher and Christopher Harmston playing in a team of four who won the Woking Wood-Pecker Junior Tournament: Ross Fisher and Sam Osbourne being the two outstanding scholars during the year.

On attaining the age of 18, three golf scholars, Aaron, Peter and Salina will be going up to university and leaving the Scheme on their 19th birthdays. We would like to wish them all success. As a consequence, we will be recruiting their replacements later in the year.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Tennis: this section of the scholarship provides intensive individual and squad training for young players with outstanding potential. Every encouragement is given to practice and compete, and the Club's resident professional travels with the scholars as much as possible.

Julia Smith and Luke Campbell resigned from the scholarship and are now sponsored by the LTA. Julia represents Great Britain at Junior level and Luke is coached by Peter Fleming. Robert Green qualified for the under-16 nationals and has won two under-18 singles titles. Ross Tarling qualified for the under-14 nationals and is winner of several under-16 titles. He has also won the Buckinghamshire County Closed. Michael Cooper played several under-14 tournaments, where he won through to the quarter and semi-finals. Paul Brighten played for Surrey County juniors, but he unfortunately missed the spring and summer through injury. Raymond and Toussaint Samuel competed in several tournaments at under-14 level, both winning through to the finals.

Research and Development

Consequent upon the review of the structure and development of the Scheme, it was decided to reduce the number of trustees to six and because of some confusion in the name, it was agreed to change the name "Scholarship" to "Foundation," effective from 12 May 1997.

Fund Raising

The Trustees express their gratitude to the Members, Club Management and individual donors who continue to generously support the charity.
