OTRICTURE COMPRIANCE AND MANAGRATHE

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Wentworth Golf and Tennis Foundation is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee. The Memorandum and Articles of Association were signed on 25th July 1991. The charity is directed by a Board of Trustees. New trustees are appointed based on the resource and skills they can contribute to the Foundation and are usually existing Wentworth Club members or employees.

OBJECTIVES, AIMS AND ACTIVITIES

The objectives for which the charity is established are to organise and provide facilities to enable pupils of schools, universities and other educational establishments in the UK to play golf, tennis or other games or sports and to provide facilities for recreation for the benefit of those who by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, poverty or social and economic circumstances have a need of such facilities.

We have referred to the guidance in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our objectives, aims and activities and in planning our future activities. In particular, the trustees plan the activities of the charity in order to contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

The aims of the foundation continue to be to provide tuition and facilities to selected youngsters with potential in golf and tennis and the opportunity to develop their skills. The charity uses the infrastructure, employees and members of the renowned Wentworth Club to provide professional coaching, advice, guidance and support through their training and competitions. A number of scholars are selected to balance the objectives and scope of the charity with the benefaction of Wentworth Club and its members, seeking to maximise the benefit to those selected scholars during the scholarship period of up to nine years for golf and up to six years for tennis. Success is measured by the improvements made to each individual, illustrated by their achievements in Club, local, national and even international competitions.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

It has been yet another successful year for the Foundation with our scholars all showing commitment and improvement in their respective sections of the club.

The new owner of Wentworth Club Limited, Reignwood Group, has indicated that they wish the Foundation to continue.

Golf Review

A number of changes took place, during the year, leaving us with 24 scholars, 3 of which, Andy Horgan, Scott Bryan and Josh Shelley are at University/College in the USA. Thus we had 21 active scholars at the club.

10 of our scholars have represented Surrey County at various levels

- Holly Bainbridge, playing in a Ladies section competition, won a Division1 England medal on the East course.
- William Hobbs won, The Foxhills Junior Open and The Surrey County under 18 match play championship.
- In Junior County week Bella Corwell won 3 matches against Kent, Hampshire and Middlesex
- Ronnie Mitchell won Junior Club Championship
- New scholar Grace Bishop won the Junior Bernard Trophy
- Billy Costello-won Surrey "Race to the Stars" competition (under 14)-Won Surrey Rookie order of merit.
- Lucy Wall won Ladies section Kathleen Caird Trophy

The handicap review showed excellent progress again with 15 down ,6 the same and 1 up. The main ones being Grace Bishop down 14, Ben Goodridge down 10, Jamie Tovey down 10, Oliver Wilson down 10 and Jack Kurzberg down 8.

Scholars won the annual match vs the Club and now lead the series 6/4

Tennis Review

There were no new applicants in the year under review and therefore no new intake. As a result, we have introduced a Foundation Junior programme where we take on children at age 6, for a 2 year programme with group lessons. 13 came for assessment and 6 were taken on.

Daniel Leemans left the programme. Carla Nokes and Harry Pfeiffer have become senior scholars as they have reached exit age.

We now have 8 tennis Scholars and 6 Foundation Juniors.

- Isabel Purser was given a wild card to Tennis Europe (under 12) event in Belgium, selected days training with the National Coach and accepted into 5 day National event at Roehampton
- Jack Chapman won 2 under 16 tournaments at age 14 and was runner up in 2 at under 18 level.
- Liliana Fleming has been invited to Bisham Abbey for coaching 1 day per week.

In the Junior Club Championships,

- Tom Marsalek won boys under 12 and under 14,
- Liliana Fleming won the girls under 12,
- Issey Purser won the girls under14
- Jack Chapman won the boys under 16.

The club won the annual match versus Scholars and it is now 1/1 in the series.

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (CONTINUED)

Financial Review

Regular annual contributions from the members at Wentworth Club during 2015/16 were consistent with prior year. Cash and reserve balances continue to be satisfactory, although the creditor with Wentworth Club Limited will need to be settled within the next 12 months.

RESERVES POLICY

Reserves are regularly reviewed by the trustees and appropriate action taken to ensure they are maintained at a level necessary to adequately meet the obligations of the Foundation. At period end 31 March 2016 the Foundation held £45,609 in unrestricted reserves plus £3,000 in restricted funds. The trustees have reviewed this and felt that it is at an appropriate level in order to meet the obligations of the Foundation in the future, in particular to provide additional support for scholars capable of progressing to a professional career in their chosen sport.

The Trustees believe that the Foundation has sufficient resources and foreseeable income to continue its operations for at least twelve months from the date of this report. For this reason the accounts are prepared on the going concern basis.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

3 golf Scholars left leaving us with 24 and pending clarification, from Reignwood Group, regarding the future of the Foundation, no more were recruited. Reignwood Group has now confirmed that they wish the Foundation to continue and have given their assurance of continued support. Further recruitment will continue in 2017.

1 Tennis scholar left leaving us with 8. We continued to struggle to find suitable tennis scholars and have introduced a new category of "Foundation Juniors" This involves taking in youngsters at around age 6/7, having group rather than individual lessons. 6 were taken on and so far the initiative is proving very successful. From this group the expectation is that new scholars will emerge.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the trustees have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.
- observe the principles and methods of the Charities SORP
- state whether applicable UK accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with Companies Act 2006. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions for small companies under Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006 an in accordance with the Statement Of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015).

Report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2016 set out on pages 6-11.

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES AND INDEPENDENT EXAMINER

The charity's trustees (who are also the directors of Wentworth Golf and Tennis Foundation for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed. The charity's gross income exceeded £25,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.

Having satisfied myself that the charity is not subject to audit under company law and is eligible for independent examination, it is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards (FRSSE- effective 1 January 2015), the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015)), the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards.

(b) Recognition of incoming resources

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when:

- the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- the trustees are probable they will receive the resources; and
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the SOFA at the same time as the gift to which they relate.

(d) Investment income

This is included in the accounts when receivable.

(e) Expenditure

Liability recognition

- Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.

Support Costs

- Support costs are those functions that assist the work of the Foundation but do not directly undertake charitable activities. They include governance costs relating to the examination of the financial statements. The bases on which support costs have been allocated are set out in note 5.

Irrecoverable VAT

- Irrecoverable VAT is charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period in which it arises.

(f) Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

12. COMPANY LIMITED BY GUARANTEE

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and does not have share capital. Every member undertakes to contribute to the assets in the event of the company being wound up such amount as may be required not exceeding £1 each.

13. INTANGIBLE INCOME

Wentworth Club Limited provides administrative support by employees and the use of its infrastructure to the Foundation. It is not practical to quantify this support in financial terms, but it is minimal relative to the roles and responsibilities of the individuals concerned.

14. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Some of the trustees of the Foundation are also employees of Wentworth Club Limited. During the year the Club owed the Foundation £30,093 in respect of donations received from Club members and the net surplus from the Club's Bonfire Display; the Foundation owed the Club £31,908 in respect of costs relating to golf /tennis coaching and matches. At the year end the total amount due to the Club was £41,845 (2015:£40,030).
