STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Wentworth Golf and Tennis Foundation is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee. The Memorandum and Articles of Association were signed on 25th July 1991. The charity is directed by a Board of Trustees. New trustees are appointed based on the resource and skills they can contribute to the Foundation and are usually existing Wentworth Club members or employees.

OBJECTIVES, AIMS AND ACTIVITIES

The objectives for which the charity is established are to organise and provide facilities to enable pupils of schools, universities and other educational establishments in the UK to play golf, tennis or other games or sports and to provide facilities for recreation for the benefit of those who by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, poverty or social and economic circumstances have a need of such facilities.

We have referred to the guidance in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our objectives, aims and activities and in planning our future activities. In particular, the trustees plan the activities of the charity in order to contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

The aims of the foundation continue to be to provide tuition and facilities to selected youngsters with potential in golf and tennis and the opportunity to develop their skills. The charity uses the infrastructure, employees and members of the renowned Wentworth Club to provide professional coaching, advice, guidance and support through their training and competitions. A number of scholars are selected to balance the objectives and scope of the charity with the benefaction of Wentworth Club and its members, seeking to maximise the benefit to those selected scholars during the scholarship period of up to nine years for golf and up to six years for tennis. Success is measured by the improvements made to each individual, illustrated by their achievements in Club, local, national and even international competitions.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The year to 31st March 2015 has been another excellent year for the Foundation with scholars demonstrating high commitment to the programme and achieving excellent performance improvements. During the year we had 25 golf and 9 tennis scholars in the scheme.

Golf Review

We say goodbye this year to Emily Earles, Duncan Sawers, Annabel Dimmock, Nick Peters and Luke Wignall, who left during the year.

New recruits joining the Foundation are Daniel Stafford, Ella Hammond-Baveystock, Joshua Balson-Scales and Oliver Wilson.

Of the 25 golf scholars, 14 reduced their handicaps down during the year and we had 7 scholars in Category 1.

Leaders were Ella Hammond-Baveystock who has brought her handicap down 16 to 20, Oliver Wilson who has reduced his handicap by 7 down to 21 and Joshua Balson-Scales whose handicap has come down by 6 to 12.

Annabel Dimmock continued with her excellent form and was selected to represent Great Britain and Ireland in the Curtis Cup against the USA in St Louis. Sadly the team lost, but Annabel performed well. She finished the year as the leading player in the GB & I Order of Merit and was ranked 10 in the world. She has now turned professional.

Andy Horgan has played for his American university team on several occasions, which is good for a first year student. His studies are going well.

Scott Bryan has played regularly for his American college team and out of 6 competitions had a 1st, a 2nd and two 3rd3s.

Josh Shelley has reduced his handicap to scratch and he too is off to the USA, having been offered a place at Murray State College.

Daniel Stafford won the Bernard Gallacher Trophy.

Bella Cordwell won the EWGA Medal on the West Course. She has been selected into the English Girls Regional Development Squad.

Ella Hammond-Baveystock won a junior girls handicap competition at Goring and Streatley. Ella also won a Berkshire girls stableford at Royal Ascot.

Holly Bainbridge won an English Girls Regional Championship. Holly also won the Baylis Cup at Maidenhead.

The annual Club versus Scholars golf match was won by the Club. The Scholars now lead 5/4 in the series.

Tennis Review

Isabelle Purser, a new scholar, is highly talented with great potential. Isabelle represented England at Under 12 level in France. Sadly she lost the singles in the quarter finals and the doubles in the final.

Carla Nokes had wins at both the Under 16 and Under 18 at Sutton Academy. Carla also won at St George's Hill. She is improving all the time and will become a senior scholar next year.

Adele Nokes achieved the title of Junior Club Champion in both the Under 14 and Under 16's.

Liliana Fleming is ranked No. 1 for her Under 10 age group in Berkshire.

Harry Pfeiffer, having reached age 16, now becomes a senior scholar as he intends to pursue a career in coaching.

The inaugural Club versus Tennis Scholars Match was won by the Scholars 7/5.

Financial Review

Regular annual contributions from the members at Wentworth Club during 2014/15 were consistent with prior year. However, additional restricted funds secured last year for elite coaching to Annabel Dimmock, was not

repeated this year. Bonfire night, however, was better attended and costs better managed than the previous year.

Cash and reserve balances continue to be satisfactory, although the creditor with Wentworth Club Limited will need to be settled within the next 12 months.

RESERVES POLICY

Reserves are regularly reviewed by the trustees and appropriate action taken to ensure they are maintained at a level necessary to adequately meet the obligations of the Foundation. At period end 31 March 2015 the Foundation held £47,014 in unrestricted reserves plus £3,000 in restricted funds. The trustees have reviewed this and felt that it is at an appropriate level in order to meet the obligations of the Foundation in the future, in particular to provide additional support for scholars capable of progressing to a professional career in their chosen sport.

The Trustees believe that the Foundation has sufficient resources and foreseeable income to continue its operations for at least twelve months from the date of this report. For this reason the accounts are prepared on the going concern basis.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

We are currently full in golf but have 2 spaces in the tennis scholarship schemes, with 25 golf and 9 tennis scholars. As there is normally a shortage of tennis applications we will still consider recruiting additional tennis scholars if the opportunity should arise, and routine recruitment is ongoing to ensure new scholars are found to replace those who have finished their term with the Foundation.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the trustees have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.
- observe the principles and methods of the Charities SORP

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with Companies Act 2006. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2015 set out on pages 6-11.

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES AND INDEPENDENT EXAMINER

The charity's trustees (who are also the directors of Wentworth Golf and Tennis Foundation for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed. The charity's gross income exceeded £25,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.

Having satisfied myself that the charity is not subject to audit under company law and is eligible for independent examination, it is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005), the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards.

(b) Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small.

(c) Recognition of incoming resources

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when:

- the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources; and
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the SOFA at the same time as the gift to which they relate.

(d) Investment income

This is included in the accounts when receivable.

(e) Expenditure

Liability recognition

- Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.

Governance costs

- Include costs of the preparation and examination of statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

Support Costs

- Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories in proportion to the time spent by individual members of staff and with reference to the salaries of those staff.

Irrecoverable VAT

- Irrecoverable VAT is charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period in which it arises.

(f) Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.
