1 General information

The company is a private company limited by share capital incorporated in UK.

The address of its registered office is: Terminal Building Redhill Aerodrome Kings Mill Lane Surrey RH1 5YP

2 Accounting policies

Summary of significant accounting policies and key accounting estimates

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 Section 1A - 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006.

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared using the historical cost convention except that as disclosed in the accounting policies certain items are shown at fair value.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis despite the deficit on the retained profit and loss account and the losses in the current and previous year because the directors hold the opinion that the company will remain profitable in the future. Improved trading in the subsidiaries is expected to continue and this is the basis for this opinion.

Revenue recognition

Turnover comprises the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for the sale of goods and provision of services in the ordinary course of the company's activities. Turnover is shown net of sales/value added tax, returns, rebates and discounts.

The company recognises revenue when:

The amount of revenue can be reliably measured;

it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity;

and specific criteria have been met for each of the company's activities.

Tax

The tax expense for the period comprises current tax. Tax is recognised in profit or loss, except that a change attributable to an item of income or expense recognised as other comprehensive income is also recognised directly in other comprehensive income.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date in the countries where the company operates and generates taxable income.

Business combinations

Business combinations are accounted for using the purchase method. The consideration for each acquisition is measured at the aggregate of the fair values at acquisition date of assets given, liabilities incurred or assumed, and equity instruments issued by the group in exchange for control of the acquired, plus any costs directly attributable to the business combination. When a business combination agreement provides for an adjustment to the cost of the combination contingent on future events, the group includes the estimated amount of that adjustment in the cost of the combination at the acquisition date if the adjustment is probable and can be measured reliably.

Investments

Investments in equity shares which are publicly traded or where the fair value can be measured reliably are initially measured at fair value, with changes in fair value recognised in profit or loss. Investments in equity shares which are not publicly traded and where fair value cannot be measured reliably are measured at cost less impairment.

Interest income on debt securities, where applicable, is recognised in income using the effective interest method. Dividends on equity securities are recognised in income when receivable.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Trade debtors

Trade debtors are amounts due from customers for merchandise sold or services performed in the ordinary course of business.

Trade debtors are recognised initially at the transaction price. They are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. A provision for the impairment of trade debtors is established when there is objective evidence that the company will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivables.

Trade creditors

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Accounts payable are classified as current liabilities if the company does not have an unconditional right, at the end of the reporting period, to defer settlement of the creditor for at least twelve months after the reporting date. If there is an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the reporting date, they are presented as non-current liabilities.

Trade creditors are recognised initially at the transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Borrowings

Interest-bearing borrowings are initially recorded at fair value, net of transaction costs. Interest-bearing borrowings are subsequently carried at amortised cost, with the difference between the proceeds, net of transaction costs, and the amount due on redemption being recognised as a charge to the Profit and Loss Account over the period of the relevant borrowing.

Interest expense is recognised on the basis of the effective interest method and is included in interest payable and similar charges.

Borrowings are classified as current liabilities unless the company has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting date.

Share capital

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Equity instruments are measured at the fair value of the cash or other resources received or receivable, net of the direct costs of issuing the equity instruments. If payment is deferred and the time value of money is material, the initial measurement is on a present value basis.

Terms of loans from related parties

C R H Stone (Director and shareholder in the company) advanced the company £500,000 (2016: £500,000) in the year leaving £503,455 outstanding at the balance sheet date (2016: fully repaid in the year).

Interest was charged at the rate of 7% amounting to £2,205 (2016: £548) and an arrangement fee of £1,250 was charged (2016: £1,250).

In 2016 A H Scott and A J Stone (both directors and shareholders in the company) advanced the company £400,000 on which interest was charged at 4% amounting to £570 and £395 respectively. An arrangement fee of £1,000 was charged for both.

At the balance sheet date the amount due from Redhill Aerodrome Limited was £2,683,846 (2016: £1,435,843).

Redhill Aerodrome Trading Limited

(Wholly owned subsidiary)

The loan from Redhill Aerodrome Trading Limited is unsecured and bears no fixed repayment terms. The directors

confirm that the loan is repayable on demand. No interest was payable on the loan.

At the balance sheet date the amount due to Redhill Aerodrome Trading Limited was £95,978 (2016: £294,436 due from Redhill Aerodrome Trading Limited £291,233).

St Albans Capital LLP

(A J Stone and C R H Stone, directors in this company, are members)

The accounts include a charge of 45,000 (2016: £30,000).

At the balance sheet date the amount due to St Albans Capital LLP was £42,244 (2016: £21,106).
