1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention

The company is still operating in the development stage of its activities. Until a breakthrough into profitable trading is made the company is entirely dependent upon its shareholders, stockholders and suppliers to provide the resources with which to carry out its development activities. After reviewing the year end position, the company has raised funds by the issue of new shares and loan stock in the company together with other external funds. The company considers that with the continuing support of shareholders, stockholders and suppliers it can continue to operate within its agreed facilities. The directors therefore feel it appropriate that the accounts are prepared on the going concern basis. The announcement referred to in Note 14 should have a significant effect on future prospects.

1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated)

13 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts

1 4 Research and development

Research expenditure is written off to the profit and loss account in the year in which it is incurred Development expenditure is written off in the same way unless the directors are satisfied as to the technical, commercial and financial viability of individual projects. In this situation, the expenditure is deferred and amortised over the period during which the company is expected to benefit. The Directors intend to amortise deferred development expenditure against the sale proceeds of the first twelve railcars.

1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows

13 Related party transactions

During the year the company has purchased goods and services from JPM Parry and Associates Limited totalling £94,900 (2005 £107,570). All transactions were on normal commercial terms. 14 Post balance sheet events

On 21 June it was announced that the West Midlands rail franchise had been awarded to Govia who intend to operate a seven day a week service on the Stourbridge branch line using two new PPM 60 railcars. The procedures for the order of the railcars are still to be finalised but the company considers this to be the long awaited breakthrough for environmental rail transport.
