NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 25 DECEMBER 2012

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention modified to include the revaluation of freehold land and buildings and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

1.2 Changes in accounting policies

During the current year the directors have reviewed the accounting for the members' loans of £80,996 previously included in creditors. After considering the original documentation the directors have determined that these loans are repayable at the discretion of the company and so has been transferred to other reserves. This is a change in the company's accounting policies and has resulted in a prior year adjustment. This adjustment has increased the reserves brought forward by £80,996.

1.3 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated)

14 Turnover

Turnover comprises ground and other rents receivable in respect of the property owned by the company

1 5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Investment properties are included in the balance sheet at their open market value. Depreciation is provided only on those investment properties which are leasehold and where the unexpired lease term is less than 20 years.

Although this accounting policy is in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), it is a departure from the general requirement of the Companies Act 2006 for all tangible assets to be depreciated. In the opinion of the directors compliance with the standard is necessary for the financial statements to give a true and fair view. Depreciation or amortisation is only one of many factors reflected in the annual valuation and the amount of this which might otherwise have been charged cannot be separately identified or quantified.

1.6 Sale of lease extensions

The company recognises the income on the sale of lease extensions at completion. Net proceeds in excess of the resulting reduction in the carrying value of the property is included in Other Operating Income. A transfer is made from the Revaluation Reserve to the Profit and Loss Account in the reserves note for the difference between the associated carrying value of the leases and the historic cost.
