### Directors' report

For the year ended 29 March 1998

### Principal activities and business review

On 14 August 1995 the Horse Exchange title and goodwill of the business was sold for £200,000. At that date, the company ceased to trade.

### Directors' responsibilities

### Statement of accounting policies

29 March 1998

A summary of the principal accounting policies, all of which have been consistently applied throughout the year and the preceding period, is set out below.

#### Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

At 29 March 1998 the company had net liabilities of £112,208 (1997: £112,242). The directors are of the opinion that the going concern basis continues to be the appropriate basis for the preparation of the accounts as a fellow group undertaking has confirmed its intention and ability to provide such financial support as may be necessary to enable the company to continue to operate as a going concern and to meet all of its obligations in full for the next twelve months. The company's ultimate parent company has also confirmed that the company will not be required to pay amounts due to other group undertakings unless the company has sufficient funds to pay other creditors in full.

#### Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the period and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. Provision is made for deferred tax only to the extent that it is probable that an actual liability will crystallise.

#### Cash flow statement

Under the provisions of Financial Reporting Standard 1, the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Hurst Publishing Limited, whose accounts include a consolidated cash flow statement.

### Related party transactions

Under the provisions of Financial Reporting Standard 8, the company is exempt from the requirement to disclose details of related party transactions as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Hurst Publishing Limited whose consolidated accounts are publicly available.
