DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors take pleasure in submitting their annual report and the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 March 1996.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company is to act as a wholesale provider of securities research, dealing, settlement and custody services to professional intermediaries.

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS

LawShare's third full year of trading saw a further widening of the firm's client base as new professional intermediaries, chiefly firms of solicitors, developed their investment management services. Market conditions were favourable throughout the year, and record results were achieved. The profit on ordinary activities after taxation was £130,453 up 125% on the previous year. Throughout the year the company maintained financial resources well in excess of regulatory requirements. Substantial resources have been dedicated to preparation for the CREST settlement system, including an upgrade of computer systems and development of LawShare's own software for its sponsored membership service.

DIVIDENDS AND TRANSFERS TO RESERVES

Dividends of £62,000 were paid during the year (1995 - £36,000).

After dividends retained profits of £68,453 were transferred to reserves (1995 - £21,789).

FIXED ASSETS

Fixed assets with a cost of £56,642 (1995 - £16,409) were acquired during the year (see note 11). The directors reviewed the estimated useful life of computer equipment during the year and on the grounds of prudence have reduced it from 5 to 4 years commencing 1 April 1995. A provision of £5,500 was charged to profit in respect of software to be written off as a result of systems changes prior to the introduction of CREST.

FURTHER DEVELOPMENTS

The company is continuing to develop non-dealing revenues in the form of publications, training activities, custody and administration services. During 1996/97 it is hoped that higher revenues will be earned through both custody and administration services. The signs are that the resources dedicated to CREST will add a significant new leg to revenue in 1997/98 but that 1996/97 could prove testing, especially if slower market conditions coincide with the continuing high level of preparatory CREST costs.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted by the directors are described below.

Accounting convention

These accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention.

Financial accounting period

The financial statements are drawn up for a 12 month period ended 31 March 1996. The comparative period is for the 12 months ended 31 March 1995.

Turnover

Turnover represents the commission income from buying and selling securities on behalf of clients and non-dealing revenues in the form of publications, training activities and administration services.

Trade date accounting

Turnover is arrived at under the principles of trade date accounting for Stock Exchange transactions.

Fixed assets

For all tangible fixed assets depreciation is calculated to write down their cost to the estimated residual values by equal annual instalments over the period of their estimated useful economic lives, which are considered to be:

Fixtures and equipment - 2 years Computer equipment - 4 years

Balances with clients and counterparties

In accordance with market practice certain balances with clients and market counterparties, Stock Exchange member firms and settlement office are included in debtors and creditors gross for their unsettled bought and sold transactions respectively.

Operating leases

Amounts due under operating leases are charged to profit and loss account in equal annual amounts over the lease term.

Foreign exchange

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates ruling at the dates of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are translated at the rates ruling at that date. These translation differences are dealt with in the profit and loss account.

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided at the anticipated tax rates on timing differences arising from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in tax computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the financial statements to the extent that it is probable that a liability or asset will crystallise in the future.

The 'A' shares entitle the holder to a dividend at the rate of 15% per annum on the capital of the company. The 'B' shares entitle the holder to a dividend at the rate of the Midland bank plc base rate per annum on the capital of the company. The Founders shares entitle the holder to a dividend at the rate of 0.165% of the net profits of the company after tax and other dividends. No such dividend has been paid and were this to be paid, the amount including interest thereon would be approximately £50,000. Any balance of such profits which the directors decide to distribute, shall be applied in paying dividends on the 'A', 'B' and 'C' ordinary shares ranking pari passu.

On a winding-up, any surplus assets will first be applied to paying the dividend arrears (and any interest thereto) of the 'A' shares, then 'B'shares, and then Founders shares. Any balance remaining will be used to repay the holders of the Founders shares the capital paid up on those shares, and the balance of assets left will be divided between the holders of the 'A', 'B' and 'C' ordinary shares ranking pari passu.

The four classes of share rank equally in terms of voting rights.
