STRATEGIC REPORT

The directors present the Annual Report and Financial Statements of AA The Driving School Agency Limited ("the Company") for the year ended 31 January 2018.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Automobile Association Developments Limited.

The principal activity of the Company is to act as an agent to collect and transfer sums of money for pupils cash receipts to another company within the group, subject to agency agreements. The Company does not trade.

The statement of financial position on page 6 of the financial statements shows the Company's financial position at the year end.

For decision making and internal performance management, management's key performance metric is net assets. Net assets remained at £2 (2017: £2).

RISK MANAGEMENT FRAMEWORK

The Company is part of the AA plc group which has developed an embedded enterprise risk management process that facilitates the identification, assessment, escalation and mitigation of the Company's risk exposure across every aspect and activity of the business. This framework enables the business to manage risk using predefined assessment criteria to ensure residual risk levels are in line with the Board's agreed risk appetite.

The AA plc group has put in place rigorous procedures and controls designed to prevent significant risks to the business occurring or to mitigate their effects if they should occur. These controls are monitored by the Risk, Compliance and Internal Audit functions to ensure they are working effectively.

The principal risks and uncertainties facing the Company are considered to be:

Financial Risk

Financial risks are managed centrally by the group Treasury team taking into account the Company's position as part of the group with due consideration being given to the impact of transactions with other group entities.

Opinion

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1 Presentation of financial statements

AA The Driving School Agency Limited is incorporated and domiciled in England and Wales.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis.

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework (FRS101). The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

No Income Statement is presented by the Company as permitted by Section 408 of the Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements are prepared in Sterling and are rounded to the nearest £1.

2 Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation

The accounting policies which follow set out those policies which apply in preparing the financial statements for the year ended 31 January 2018.

2.2 Significant Accounting policies

a) Trade receivables and trade payables

A provision for impairment of trade receivables is established when there is objective evidence that the Group will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivables.
