1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

The following principal accounting policies have been applied

Going concern

The company reports net liabilities of £3,597,376 as at 31 December 2011. The directors expect that they will need the continued support of the parent company for a period of at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements. The directors have received a letter of support from the parent company and the directors believe that the parent company has the intention and ability to support the company for the foreseeable future. On this basis, the directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements of the company on a going concern basis.

Turnover

Turnover represents sales to external customers at invoiced amounts less value added tax or local taxes on sales. Revenue is recognised when the risks and rewards of owning the goods have passed to the customer which is generally on delivery.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost, less estimated residual values, of all tangible fixed assets, except for investment properties and freehold land, evenly over their expected useful lives. It is calculated at the following rates

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is based on the cost of purchase on an average cost basis. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less additional costs to completion and disposal. Work in progress includes any directly attributable overheads.

Foreign currency

Foreign currency transactions are translated into sterling at the rates ruling when they occurred. Foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities are translated at the rates ruling at the balance sheet date. Any differences are taken to the profit and loss account.

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except that the recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that the company anticipates making sufficient taxable profits in the future to absorb the reversal of the underlying timing differences. Deferred tax balances are not discounted

Leased assets

Annual rentals under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease

Pension costs

Contributions to the company's defined contribution pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the year in which they become payable
