Summary of the years' activities - in the period under review

- The Centre satisfactorily completed its sixth year at Muncaster Chase and celebrated 20 years of service at Knott End and Muncaster Chase in August
- The Centre continued to gather healing outcomes data for possible further research projects
- The trustees accepted the Annual Accounts, showing a return to nominal surplus of £4,610 with sufficient reserves to make good any unforeseen shortfall
- The Centre continued to offer healing treatment to all who came in need, referred or self-referred, five days a week at Muncaster Chase and one day per week in hospitals, hospices, residential homes or the homes of clients too ill to travel. The Sheila Robinson Memorial Fund and donations from charitable trusts and companies helped to make up the difference between donations received for healing treatment and the actual costs of providing the service.
- The Centre provided presentations, talks, information and project support for conferences and study groups, in Cumbria and nationally. The Centre Director lectured at the annual conference of the Christian Meditation Community at Stirling University and spoke to the Ravenglass Mothers' Union. She was among the nominees at the Cumbrian Woman of the Year lunch, attended the High Sheriff's lunch for Princess Alexandra at Muncaster Castle and a Buckingham Palace garden party at the invitation of the Queen.
- ❖ The Centre sponsored or participated in local fundraising events Muncaster Castle Pelt a Pennington for April Fool's Day, Muncaster Castle Five Day Festival of Fools, Muncaster Chase Open Day and the Centre Christmas Fair
- Increasing numbers of volunteers continued to help indoors and out at the Centre, planning and supporting communal and fundraising activities. The Muncaster Healing Garden project developed with expansion of flower, fruit, and vegetable planting and the erection of a second greenhouse.
- Shepley apprentices made a wrought iron archway over the wheelchair path, gates for the back courtyard and the tool shed, stairs in courtyard and bird feeders

- The annual newsletter reached over three thousand friends and supporters of the Centre, by post or e-mail, with additional reports available during the year on our website, Friends' newsletter and Facebook. The Centre contributes a monthly page to the local Parish News, which serves five parishes in the local benefice.
- Our regularly updated website, <u>www cccare org</u> received average of 2,250 hits per month. The Centre Manager also offers a blog, From the Centre Managers Desk, detailing the ups and down of a small charity in a remote area. Visitors from across the country and abroad have come to see the Centre and to seek help.
- We received press coverage on BBC Radio Cumbria, the Whitehaven News and Energize, the newspaper for Sellafield Ltd

Review of the Business – The Charity operates as a company limited company limited by guarantee and does not have a share capital. A summary of the Income and Expenditure for the year is given on page 5 of the accounts. The Trustees are content with the current state of affairs.

Fixed Assets- There was no change in the company's fixed assets during the year. Details of fixed assets are shown in Note 1 to these Accounts
