REPORT OF THE AUDITORS TO THE MEMBERS OF ROCHDALE GATEWAY LEISURE LIMITED (A COMPANY LIMITED BY GUARANTEE)

We have audited the accounts on pages 3 to 8 which have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out on page 5.

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF DIRECTORS AND AUDITORS

As described on page 1, the company's directors are responsible for the preparation of accounts. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those accounts and to report our opinion to you.

BASIS OF OPINION

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board, except that the scope of our work was limited as explained below:-

An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the accounts. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the accounts, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the accounts are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. However, in common with other charities of similar size and organisation the evidence available to us was limited because £8,117 of the company's recorded income comprised of donations and sundry receipts over which there was no system of control on which we could rely for the purposes of our audit. There were no other satisfactory audit procedures that we could adopt to confirm that donation income was properly recorded.

In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the accounts.

OPINION

Except for any adjustments that might have been found necessary had we been able to obtain sufficient evidence concerning donation income in our opinion the accounts give a true and fair view of the state of the company's affairs at 5 April 1997 and of the excess of income over expenditure for the year ended on that date and have been properly prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act 1985 applicable to small companies.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 5 APRIL 1997

1. COMPANY STATUS

The company is limited by guarantee and is a registered charity. At 5 April 1997 there were 47 members of the company. Their liability in respect of the guarantee as set out in the memorandum of association is limited to £1 per guarantor.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting by charities.

Cash flow

The accounts do not include a cash flow statement because the company, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under Financial Reporting Standard 1 'cash flow statements'.

Income

Grants received are credited in the year received except where they are for a specific purpose in which case they are credited in the year in which the expenditure is incurred.

Rents are credited to income when receivable.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:-

Improvements to property - 20% on cost

Fixtures and fittings - 15% on net book value Specialised equipment - 25% on cost

The company is a registered charity and as such is entitled to the exemption from tax to the extent that the income received falls within section 505 I.C.T.A. 1988 and section 256 C.G.T. 1992 and is applied to charitable purposes only.

Pensions

Contributions in respect of the company's defined contribution pension scheme are charged to the income and expenditure account for the year in which they are payable to the scheme.

Management and administration costs

These costs are allocated between restricted and unrestricted funds based on the committee's best estimate.
