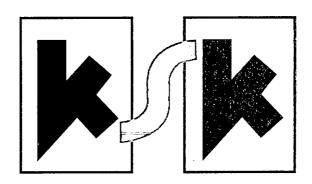

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006. Members of the charitable company guarantee to contribute an amount not exceeding £1 to the assets of the Charitable Company in the event of winding up. The total number of guarantees at 31st March 2015 was 20.

The word 'Limited' is omitted by license of the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2015

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Appointment of new Executive Board Members

The Executive Board should consist of a minimum of six and a maximum of eighteen Members. The Executive Board Members are elected by the Members of the Centre at a General Meeting (or Annual General Meeting, if any) and shall hold office for a year but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chair's period of office shall be two years renewable to a maximum of eight years. The maximum period on the Executive shall also be eight consecutive years for all other Members. When elected Members of the Executive complete their terms of office the Executive will invite the Members of the Centre to provide nominations for candidates to stand for election. The Executive can appoint any person whether a Member of the Centre or not to be a co-opted Member of the Executive. The total number of co-opted Members shall not exceed two. Any co-opted Member of the Executive shall cease to be a co-opted Member if he/she becomes an elected Member.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

The trustees have identified the major risks during the financial period as being the short-term nature of current funding resources, and the need to maintain staffing levels at a level which is affordable whilst bearing in mind the problems and likely time delays involved in training new staff or recruiting trained staff. In addition to the rolling three-year strategic plan, the trustees regularly review a status report highlighting potential risks and prioritising actions.

Internal risks are considered minimal by the implementation of financial procedures that are periodically reviewed to ensure they are working efficiently.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Principal Objects and activities

Relate Milton Keynes is a relationship support organisation. In planning their activities for the year, trustees kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

The impact of our services is to alleviate emotional suffering caused by relationship problems and to reduce the cost of relationship breakdowns in the unitary authority of Milton Keynes.

Our clients have reported that as a result of coming to Relate Milton Keynes, they experience positive impacts in terms of attendance at work or school, fewer health problems, housing, increased engagement with their local communities, fewer separations, happier, safer relationships and more intimate love lives.

Relate Milton Keynes support clients through delivering relationship counselling for adult individuals, couples, young people and families, psychosexual therapy and training courses. Although the provision of online or telephone counselling remains under review, the trustees have concluded that the initial cost in technology and in staff training are not affordable in the current financial climate. The organisation has, however, increased the distribution of information and guidance in written form through the associate charity shops and other appropriate outlets and through social media channels. The charity's aims are that adult and family counselling services benefit any client who wishes to access Relate regardless of their ability to pay, their ethnicity, sexuality, (dis)ability, faith, gender or age. The withdrawal of local authority grant funding has severely inhibited the charity's ability to service the whole community irrespective of ability to pay, but the trustees remain committed to developing and enhancing a bursary scheme to provide financial assistance to clients unable to pay the organisation's full fees.

Although local funding cuts have reduced the number of contracts, Relate MK continues to provide youth counselling for pupils in schools in the city, benefitting young people who are experiencing difficulties as a result of parental separation or adjusting to new family arrangements or other relationships.

Relate welcomes all who live or work in the unitary authority of Milton Keynes and actively promotes services (and regularly reviews how this can be improved) to populations who are currently under-represented in client demographics.

We are an independent charity that is part of a Federation of Relate charities, receiving training and overall policy decisions from Relate Central Office.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2015

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The overall counselling hours delivered by Relate Milton Keynes has increased by 3% to 4,796 hours (2014: 4,673 hours). This includes:

Family counselling
Adult relationship counselling
Sex therapy
Young people's counselling
2,794 hours (2014: 2,289 hours)
1,537 hours (2014: 2,031 hours)
238 hours (2014: 128 hours)
227 hours (2014: 225 hours)

The results of our outcomes survey for Relationship counselling clients revealed that:

98% (2014: 97%) rated their experience of Relate as 'very good' or 'good' 99% (2014: 97%) would recommend Relate to others

FUTURE STRATEGY

By supporting children, young people, families, parents, individuals, couples and organisations both through counselling and training, Relate Milton Keynes continues to take a holistic view of relationship support and is a leading early intervention, targeted, community based, front-line service provider in the city.

Relate Milton Keynes continues to monitor and develop the three-year strategic plan adopted in 2015, which will aim:

- to improve awareness of the organisation and its services with the public, local authorities and the commercial sector:
- to extend the range of services currently being offered by increasing training and education services;
- to be aware of and tender for any new opportunities for counselling in Milton Keynes;
- to establish a firm financial footing from which to build on services over the three year period of the plan.

Vision: Our vision is of a future in which healthy relationships form the heart of a thriving society.

Mission: Our mission is to provide professional relationship support by:

- Helping couples, families and individuals to make relationships work better.
- Delivering inclusive, high-quality services that are relevant at every stage of life.
- Promoting the publics and policymakers' understanding of relationships and what helps them to flourish.

Overall Aims: To help people make those personal changes which enable them to engage in positive relationships for the benefit of themselves, their family and society.

Strategic Aims: These are as follows:

- 1. To deliver a prompt service
- 2. To deliver an affordable service
- 3. To ensure that services are accessible
- 4. To ensure that services are professional
- 5. To ensure that services are effective

Impact: the impact of our services will be to alleviate emotional suffering and reduce the diverse costs of relationship breakdowns in Milton Keynes.

RESERVES POLICY

The trustees have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets held by the charity should generally be between 3 and 6 months of the resources expended. This amounts to a figure of £50,000 to £105,000 in general funds. At this level, the trustees feel that they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the likely event of a significant drop in funding.

It would obviously be necessary to consider how the funding would be replaced or activities developed to compensate. At present, the general reserves (excluding designated funds), which amount to £153,423, are comfortably above this band. The trustees will keep this policy under constant review.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF RELATE MILTON KEYNES

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31st March 2015 set out on pages six to thirteen.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees (who are also the directors for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under Section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act)) and that an independent examination is required.

Having satisfied myself that the charity is not subject to audit under company law and is eligible for independent examination, it is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under Section 145 of the 2011 Act
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission (under Section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act); and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of the independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view ' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statements below.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2015

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Land and buildings Plant and machinery - Straight line over 50 years

- Straight line over 4 years

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

Designated bursary fund This amount is set aside to cover the costs of providing counselling for those clients whose income is below a certain level and also to ensure counselling could continue to be provided if income was to cease. It was unanimously approved by The Board on 10 February 2015 to transfer the

property and premises fund to a bursary fund.

RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES 12.

The company received a covenant of £16,832 (2014 - £8,592) and a management charge of £8,000 (2014 -£8,000) from its subsidiary MK Community Shop (Shenley) Limited. The balance at the year end with MK Community Shop (Shenley) Limited was £24,872 (2014 - £16,592).
