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STRATEGIC REPORT

Business review

The group has strengthened its market position and is showing progress on all parameters. The reorganization from last finance year is now starting to filter through with better customer relationships, better execution, better systems and increased turnover etc. We expect this trend to continue.

Risk and uncertainties

The group has some financial and operational risks with foreign exchange rates and credit risk – all being carefully considered, planned and negotiated prior to contract signing.

Foreign exchange risk

The group is exposed to foreign exchange rate risk because a large part of the materials are being purchased outside the UK. The risk is closely managed by the Managing and Financial Director. The risk is managed and will continue to be managed by early purchase of the foreign currency when the contract is signed or by FX forward hedging.

Credit risk

Before any contracts are signed or orders accepted thorough credit controls procedures are completed. Credit risk is managed by either insurance or payment plans.

Contract negotiation

The group trades with larger construction contracts, where each contract is individually negotiated and signed. The contract is normally based on the standard JCT contract but with amendments. The group has extremely thorough procedures in place to negotiate and approve any amendments and thereby manage the risk.

Key performance indicators

The group has implemented and is continuing to develop a cloud based IT-system so all information is available for everyone at any given time. This information covers everything from sales forecast, order intake, execution to anticipated sales output, margins, cost budgets, production planning, EBT etc. Further, there is a management meeting held every month where all the managers are updated, in depth, on all relevant areas of the group.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The directors present their report together with financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2018.

Principal activity

The principal activity of the group during the period under review was that of curtain wall, commercial windows, fire resistant and structural glazing and steel doors and glass processing. The company provides management services to the group.

Business review

There was a profit for the year after taxation and dividend amounting to £ 825,071 (2017: loss £ 58,239).

The directors voted a dividend for the year of £ 0 (2017: £ 0).

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PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland".

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain fixed assets.

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis assuming the continued financial support of the parent company. The parent company has confirmed that it will maintain financial support for the foreseeable future to enable the company to continue normal trading operations.

The principal accounting policies of the group have remained unchanged from the previous year and are set out below.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemption

The company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland".

The requirement of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

Basis of consolidation

The group financial statements consolidate those of the company and of its subsidiary undertakings drawn up to 30 June 2018. Profits or losses on intra-group transactions are eliminated in full.

Turnover

Turnover is the total amount receivable by the group for goods supplied and services provided, excluding VAT and trade discounts.

In the case of long-term contracts, turnover reflects the contract activity during the year and represents the proportion of total contract value which costs incurred to date bear to total expected costs.

Intangible assets - goodwill on consolidation

Goodwill on consolidation arising on the acquisition of business, representing any excess of the consideration given over the fair value of the identifiable assets and liabilities, is included in the balance sheet as goodwill on consolidation and is amortized over 10 years being the expected period of use.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated to write down the cost or valuation less estimated residual value of tangible fixed assets by equal annual installments over their expected useful lives.

The periods generally applicable are:

Land and propertyNo depreciationShort leasehold improvements30 yearsPlant and machinery5 - 7 yearsMotor vehicles3 - 5 yearsFixtures and fittings5 yearsOffice and computer equipment3 - 5 years

Research and development

Research expenditure is charged to profits in the year in which it is incurred.

Development costs incurred on specific projects are capitalized when recoverability can be assessed with reasonable certainty and amortized in line with the expected sales arising from the projects. All other development costs are written off in the year of expenditure.

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PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Investments

Investments are included at cost. Profits or losses arising from disposals of fixed asset investments are treated as part of the result from ordinary activities.

Stock and work in progress

Stock and work in progress is stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value.

In the case of goods for resale and consumables, cost means purchase price including transport and handling costs, less trade discounts, calculated on a first in first out basis. In case of work in progress and finished goods, cost comprises direct materials, direct labour and attributable overheads.

Net realisable value means estimated selling price (less trade discounts) less all further costs to completion and all costs to be incurred in selling and distribution.

The attributable profit on contracts is recognised once their outcome can be assessed with reasonable certainty. The profit recognised reflects the proportion of work completed to date on the project. Costs associated with such contracts are included in work in progress to the extent that they cannot be matched with contract work accounted for as turnover. Full provision is made for losses on all contracts in the year in which the loss is first foreseen.

Pensions

The subsidiary undertakings contribute to a group personal pension scheme. The pension costs charged against profits represent the amount of the contributions payable to the schemes in respect of the accounting year.

Leased assets

Assets held under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are capitalised in the balance sheet and depreciated over expected useful lives. The interest element of leasing payments represents a constant proportion of the capital balance outstanding and is charged to the profit and loss account over the period of the lease.

All other leases are regarded as operating leases and the payments made under them are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is provided for under the liability method using the tax rates estimated to arise when the timing differences reverse and is accounted for to the extent that it is probable that a liability or asset will crystallise.

Unprovided deferred tax is disclosed as a contingent liability.

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Foreign currency

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rate ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All other exchange rate differences are dealt with through the profit and loss account.
