REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1995

The trustees present their report, together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 1995.

1. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The objects for which the Trust is established are to relieve sick and injured people in Kent by providing an air ambulance service for the benefit of the community.

The Trust's objective to increase the volume of income from fund-raising year on year has been achieved in this financial year despite the constraints on general income being experienced by individuals and businesses.

In the year under review the Trust has set in motion the means to help towards achieving its further objective, to extend the air ambulance service from five to seven days each week.

An invitation has been extended to helicopter operators to tender for the provision of the service. The contractual process has now been concluded and has lead to the award of a new contract for an air ambulance service to commence on 1 November 1995.

The Kent Air Ambulance Trust remains totally reliant upon public support to fund the operation of this community service. The Trust is not in receipt of government grants to support its work nor does it receive financial backing from the Kent Ambulance NHS Trust to which it provides a Helicopter Emergency/Medical Service (HEMS) and Air Ambulance Service which covers the County of Kent.

2. ORGANISATION

The Trust is supported centrally by a small dedicated group of paid employees who function principally from the registered offices in Staplehurst.

The Chief Executive heads the organisation and reports regularly to the Trustees informally through day to day contact and at bi-monthly meetings where formal business in conducted. A sub-committee structure with Trustees undertaking responsibility for providing advice on financial, legal and staffing matters is proving extremely effective.

As with all charities the Trust is dependent upon dedicated volunteers who devote their free time to fundraise. Without such people the county and the country would be poorer.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1995 (continued)

Financial procedures are constantly under review and management is controlled through monthly accounting procedures. It is intended to establish a monthly budgeting system following the review of the 1994/95 year when the first full year's accounts have been analysed. The Trust will purchase Sage accounting package to further improve the delivery of reports and financial summaries to keep Trustees fully informed throughout the accounting year.

The purchase of Fundmaster software will greatly improve the Trust's capacity to store and retrieve information on donors and supporters. The Trust was able to purchase this system very cheaply as a result of Fundmaster taking over Donorbase. The transfer of records will be time consuming and require training for all staff, but the benefits of reorganisation, building supporter information, cross referencing and preparing reports will be invaluable for future fund-raising.

The Trust is considering the introduction of a pension plan for staff in the future. A number of options are being considered, and will be dependent on available finances.

Kent Air Ambulance Appeal Limited, the trading arm of the charity, continues to operate from the same offices as the Trust in Staplehurst but negotiations have recently been concluded for it to lease a small business unit in Ashford to provide additional space to manage its business activities in the east of the county.

As always the Trust seeks to follow best practice in all spheres of its activities to ensure the protection of the public and safeguard the assets of the charity.

3. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND POLICIES

The principal activities are all directed towards achieving the aims and objectives of the Trust.

It is the Trust's policy constantly to review its activities and to maintain an efficient and effective organisation.

It is the policy of the Trust to maintain at least one year's operating costs in reserve as a buffer against a sudden fall in fund-raising and donations.

4. REVIEW OF ACTIVITY

During the year the Trust's Chief Executive has continued to develop links with other air ambulance organisations and those who provide helicopters in support of the front line emergency services. This has led to a closer understanding of the services which operate as part of the team at the scene of major accidents.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1995 (continued)

During the coming year it is the Trust's intention to develop a strategy for increasing the volume of funds from tax effective donations, i.e., payroll giving schemes, deeds of covenant and legacies, and to encourage the conversion of larger donations to Gift Aid.

The Trust plans to develop a supporters scheme and to provide supporters with up to date information on missions and fund-raising activities through a newsletter.

The Trust anticipated the introduction of the National Lottery by publicising its reliance on its own scratch card lottery. The Trustees remain concerned at the long term effect of the National Lottery on the Kent Air Ambulance Lottery and on charitable giving in general. Kent Air Ambulance Trust relies on income from Kent Air Ambulance Lottery for a substantial proportion of its income (one fifth). An application submitted for National Lottery Millennium funds was returned as being more suitable for National Lottery Charities Board funds. At that time medical charities were not a high priority. A further application to the National Lottery Charities Board is under consideration.

The Trust has suffered from a diminution in volunteer support for a variety of reasons which has sadly affected sales of promotional souvenirs. Dedicated volunteers are the life blood of all charities and their loyal and dedicated support is vital to the future of Kent Air Ambulance Trust. It is intended to allocate specific staff time to undertake volunteer recruitment in the coming year.

It is a fact that many people are unaware of the Trust's complete reliance on voluntary income and the Trust continues to expand opportunities to speak directly to a wide variety of organisations. The Chief Executive is supported in this by the Trustees and aircrew members.

The Trust continues to pursue its policy of building and maintaining good media relationships. Local radio and newspapers, and to a lesser extent TV are very supportive and the Trust has plans to improve the provision of media reports on missions, within the closely controlled bounds of patient confidentiality.

During the year under review the Trust has continued to develop and build on relationships with similar services in the UK and abroad. The Trust is conscious of the need to identify shared objectives and common aims and to work closer to evaluate and improve its service to patients. To this end the Trust will review the protocols for tasking the air ambulance through the 999 procedure; participate in training for ambulance control personnel in call out procedures for the air ambulance, evaluation of medical equipment and radio communications; recruitment and selection procedures for aircrew; observer training for aircrew, etc. Regular meetings between the Chief Executive and Chief Officers at Kent Ambulance Service are well established, and productive.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1995 (Continued)

The Christmas Card Campaign first established in 1993 was expanded in 1994 by combining business and domestic promotions. Adaptations to the strategy are planned for 1995 based on the results. The Trustees consider the results merit continued support for the strategy. The Trust is indebted to supporters for their support to the campaign by purchasing Christmas cards and for the additional donations which ere prompted by the Christmas promotion. The restoration of the Christmas/ New Year raffle appeal has demonstrated the effectiveness of appeals during the festive season.

The annual sponsored Weald Bike Ride, which takes place early in May, has developed as a major event, raising in excess of £12,000 each year. The extensive use of volunteers who act as motorcycle marshalls, radio communications etc. is crucial to its success.

In 1993/94 the Trust was generously supported by Wellcome Foundation which donated £2,300 to purchase a photocopier and other office equipment, demonstrating the involvement by many companies in Kent to community projects.

The following is an extract from a letter received from the mother of a victim of a road traffic accident:-

"Charlotte sustained injuries to her lungs, ribs, pelvis, jaw, ankles and back. One of the vertebra in her back was completely shattered and the spinal cord came very close to being severed. We feel it was partly due to the fact that she was taken to hospital by helicopter and not ambulance (which would have necessitated a bumpy ride through a field) that saved her from being paralysed. We are extremely grateful to you for providing this service.

Thanks to all you did, the medical attention she received and the prayers of many people, Charlotte has made a remarkable recovery and is walking without crutches and leading a near to normal life."

From 1 April 1994 to 31 March 1995 the crews of the Kent Air Ambulance responded to between 600 to 700 incidents, an average of 3 per operating day.

The Trust would like to record its appreciation to all staff, volunteers and supporters for their dedication to the more important of causes, the Kent Air Ambulance.

NOTES FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1995

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Charity's financial statements are prepared in accordance with the United Kingdom Statements of Standard Accounting Practice and Financial Reporting Standards. The principal accounting policies adopted are as follows:

Group Accounts Exemption

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption available to small groups under the Companies Act not to prepare consolidated accounts. Accordingly the financial statements present information about the charity as an individual undertaking and not about the group.

Valuation of Investment in Subsidiary Undertaking

The investment in Subsidiary Undertaking is valued in the Balance Sheet at the cost to the charity.

Cash Flow Statement

The Charity qualifies as a small company under the Companies Act 1985. The trustees have elected to take advantage of the exemptions under FRS1 not to prepare a cash flow statement.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, other than freehold land and buildings, at annual rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life as follows:

Fixtures and Fittings	20%	on written down value
Computer Equipment	25%	on written down value

Donations, Legacies and Other Voluntary Income

Income is the actual amounts received in the period from donations, legacies, fund raising events and other voluntary income.

Investment Income is recognised on an accruals basis, together with the net lottery income which is managed by an independent agent.

Investments

Investments are included in the financial Statements at the lower of cost and market value at the Balance Sheet date.

Realised gains and losses and unrealised gains and losses are added to or deducted from the general fund, and are disclosed in the Statement of Recognised Gains and Losses.

Reserve movements

All income is taken to the general fund, except where bequests have been made for a specific proposed project when they are taken to the designated fund.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES continued

Deferred Taxation

Provision is made at appropriate rates for taxation deferred in respect of all material timing differences only to the extent that, in the opinion of the directors, there is a reasonable probability that a liability will crystallise in the foreseeable future.

2. TURNOVER

The charity's income is derived mainly from voluntary donations, lottery receipts, legacies and other fund raising events and activities.
