CARDIFF GYPSY & TRAVELLER PROJECT REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2010

Structure, Governance and Management

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and is therefore governed by memorandum and articles of association. All members of the company are also trustees of the charity and there are no other trustees. The board has the power to appoint additional trustees as it considers appropriate

Objectives and Activities

The charity's objects and principal activities continue to be (i) the promotion of an understanding of Gypsies and Travellers way of life, (ii) the protection and relief of Gypsies and Travellers who are in conditions of need, hardship, sickness and distress, and (iii) the promotion of good relations by encouraging equal opportunities between Gypsies, Travellers and persons of different racial groups in a multicultural society. In achieving these objects Cardiff Gypsy & Traveller Project (CGTP) aims to support and enable Gypsies and Travellers to achieve a high and sustainable quality of life, within their own culture, through improving access to suitable accommodation, public services and employment skills.

The executive committee meet every 2 months to manage their affairs and receive regular reports from the director. A new staff structure was established in July and comprises director, office manager, and 2 liaison officers, all full-time staff. Funding for the youth development post came to an end in November.

Achievements and Performance

The charity's liaison project continued to provide an extensive information, advice and liaison service to Gypsies and Travellers as well as to all relevant statutory and voluntary providers within the boundaries of Cardiff County Council and The Vale of Glamorgan Council The project saw an average of 18 individuals a week and received 3 referrals per week from other agencies, in total an average of 27 referrals per week

The youth development project consulted with children and parents to develop a 6 month programme of activities until the end of the project in October Activities were based around the Fashion Show Live event in Newport, and a Summer scheme at a local play centre

The computer based driving theory project provided one evening session a week attended by Gypsy and Traveller young people and women. An average of 5 students per session achieved pass rates of 75% for Driving Practical and 100% for Driving Theory tests as well as receiving training in and through ICT.

A new advocacy & support programme was established in January and will provide an outreach service to vulnerable families, and work with family groups to develop family advocates and champions

Financial Review

The major funders in 2009/10 were Cardiff County Council, Cymorth, Equality & Human Rights Commission (EHRC) and the Welsh Assembly Government (WAG). Cardiff County Council and the Welsh Assembly Government funded the new core structure of the organisation. The Equalities & Human Rights Commission funded the new advocacy & support programme and Cardiff County Council continued to fund the liaison work with Gypsies and Travellers CGTP's work with Gypsy and Traveller children has been funded by Cymorth. The Trustees wish to thank all funders for their generous support during the year.

Despite this being a difficult year for charities, income increased to £158,862 as a result of new funding from the EHRC, and there was a surplus of £2,650 in the year On the 31st March 2010 unrestricted reserves had increased to £34,446 The Trustees are satisfied with the current level of reserves and are working to a reserves policy that attains free reserves to cover a minimum of three months expenditure

The past year has seen a remarkable turn around in the viability and effectiveness of CGTP The executive committee have established a clear strategy and plan for the organisation based on establishing a strong and sustainable core structure supported by key stakeholders Staff restructuring, major changes in personnel and organisational systems have this year created the platform for a stable and sustainable organisation

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2010

1 CHARITABLE STATUS

The Company is a Registered Charity under the Charities Act 1993 and is accordingly exempt from taxation on its charitable activities

2 LIABILITIES OF MEMBERS

The Company is limited by guarantee and has no share capital. The Memorandum of Association provides that every member is liable to contribute a sum not exceeding £1 in the event of the company being would up while they are a member or within one year of ceasing to be a member.

3 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- a) The Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and follow the recommendations in Statements of Recommended Practice Accounting by Charities (SORP), revised in 2005, and with the Financial Reporting Standard for smaller entities (effective January 2007)
- b) Restricted Funds are to be used for specified purposes as laid down by the Donor Expenditure which meets these criteria is identified to the Fund, together with a fair allocation of management and support costs
- Unrestricted Funds are those Funds received or generated for the objects of the Charity without further specified purpose and are available as General Funds, and for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity

d) Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement Of Financial Activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2010

3 ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

- → Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.
- → Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.
- → Investment income is included when receivable
- → Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance
- → Grants receivable for the purpose of purchasing fixed assets are credited to a Capital Grant Reserve Fund and written off over the same period as the corresponding fixed assets
- e) Depreciation is provided on all Tangible Fixed Assets at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its estimated useful life, on a 25% reducing balance basis
