Directors' report

The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2014

Results and dividends

The loss for the year amounted to £49,787 (2013: £62,888). The directors do not recommend the payment of any dividends.

Principal activities and review of the business

With effect from 31 August 2004 the Company ceased trading. All transactions recorded in the current financial year relate to interest on bank overdrafts.

The directors of Dr Martens Sports and Leisure Limited therefore consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis.

Notes to the financial statements

1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards.

Going concern

The Company is reliant on the continued financial support of other group companies. The directors of the Company's ultimate holding company Doc Topco Limited have confirmed that future liabilities of Dr Martens Sports and Leisure Limited will be met as they fall due Doc Topco Limited. The directors of Dr Martens Sports and Leisure Limited therefore consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis.

Cash flow statement

The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the Company is wholly owned and its parent publishes consolidated financial statements.

Related party transactions

The Company is wholly owned by Airwair Limited, which is a wholly owned subsidiary within the Group headed by Doc Topco Limited, the consolidated accounts of the latter are publicly available. Accordingly, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard 8 from disclosing transactions with members or investees of the Doc Topco Group.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more tax, with the following exceptions:

- provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold;
- provision is made for deferred tax that would arise on remittance of the retained earnings of overseas subsidiaries, associates and joint ventures only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, dividends have been accrued as receivable;
- deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely
 than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying
 timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.
