STRATEGIC REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2015

The directors present their strategic report for the year ended 30th June 2015.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The results for the year and financial position of the company are shown in the financial statements.

Trading performance

The principal activity and strategic focus of the group remains the design and manufacture of bathroom furniture, a market where the group retains an excellent reputation for both the quality of its product and service delivery.

The group continues to perform robustly in what remain difficult conditions, as demonstrated by the rise in sales in FY15 to £14.7m (FY14 £14.5m). This rise in sales has been underpinned by a successful strategy focused on the development of new product ranges, retaining and growing existing customers, and developing new customer accounts. This strategy is expected to continue to deliver growth in future periods, with sales for FY16 already tracking ahead of prior year. Margins going forward are also expected to benefit from a programme of operational improvements being undertaken by management across the business to improve efficiency.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. " · L

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in existence for the foreseeable future. Thus, they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Financial Reporting Standard number 1

Exemption has been taken from preparing a cash flow statement on the grounds that the parent company includes the subsidiary in its published financial statements.

Related party exemption

The company has taken advantage of exemption, under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard 8 Related Party Disclosures, not to disclose related party transactions with wholly owned subsidiaries within the group.

Turnover

Turnover represents charges for goods and services provided in the normal course of business, net of trade discounts, VAT and other sales related taxes. Turnover is recognised when the goods and services are delivered to the customer.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery

- 50% on cost and 20% on cost

Fixtures and fittings

- 50% on cost and 33% on cost

Motor vehicles

- 25% on cost

Computer equipment

- 50% on cost

Stocks

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Cost includes all direct expenditure and an appropriate proportion of labour and fixed and variable production overheads.

Deferred tax

UK corporation tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where such transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax assets are regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits against which to recover carried forward tax losses and from which the future reversal of underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured at an average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is provided in respect of all timing differences which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date except as otherwise required by FRS 19 and is measured on a non-discounted basis.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the period to which they relate.

Hire purchase and operating leases

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised as tangible fixed assets and depreciated over the shorter of their useful economic life or the period of the lease. Finance leases are those where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership are assumed by the company. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payments are charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Grants

Grants are recognised in the profit and loss account so as to match them with the expenditure towards which they are intended to contribute. Grants received relating to contribution towards specific expenditure on fixed assets, are recognised in the profit and loss account over the expected useful economic lives of the fixed assets to which they relate. Grants received to give immediate financial support or to reimburse costs previously incurred are recognised in the profit and loss account in the period in which they become receivable.

2. TURNOVER

The turnover and profit before taxation are attributable to the one principal activity of the company.

Accrued employer pension contributions amounted to £10,000 at the year end (2014 - £13,000).

18. ULTIMATE PARENT COMPANY

The immediate parent company is Utopia Group Limited, a company registered in England and Wales.

The ultimate parent undertaking is Utopia Bathroom Group Limited, a company registered in England' and Wales, which heads the largest and smallest group to consolidate the financial statements of the company. Copies of the consolidated group financial statements, which include the company, are available from the Company Secretary at Utopia House, Springvale Avenue, Springvale Business Park, Bilston, Wolverhampton WV14 0OL.

19. **CONTINGENT LIABILITIES**

As a result of the Group refinancing that took place in July 2009, the company guarantees related party loans made by Halcon Properties Limited to the ultimate parent company Utopia Bathroom Group Limited. The balance of these borrowings at 30th June 2015 amounted to £3,434,000 (2014 - £3,489,000).
