REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The Directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 20th March 1995.

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

The principal activity of the company is the design, development and manufacture of packaging equipment and seal integrity testing equipment.

On 21st May 1994, the company acquired certain of the assets and intellectual property rights of Ishida-Nonpareil Ltd.

During the year, the company continued a development programme, partly supported by the ultimate parent company, and it is expected that further products will be available for sale in the second half of next year.

On 20th March 1995, the company sold its patents and intellectual property rights to the ultimate parent company.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The results of the company for the period ended 20th March 1995 are set out in the financial statements.

The loss for the period of £77,000 has been transferred to reserves. As there are no distributable reserves, the Directors are unable to recommend the payment of a dividend.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES IN RESPECT OF THE ACCOUNTS

Company law requires the directors to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those accounts, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts; and
- prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

We have audited the accounts on pages 7 to 17 which have been prepared under the historical cost convention and on the basis of the accounting policies set out on pages 9 and 10.

Respective Responsibilities of Directors and Auditors

As described on page 5, the company's directors are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those accounts and to report our opinion to you.

Basis of Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the accounts. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the accounts, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the accounts are free from material mis-statement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion, we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

Opinion

In our opinion, the accounts give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company as at 20th March 1995 and of the loss of the company for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.

1 FUNDAMENTAL ACCOUNTING CONCEPT

The financial statements have been prepared under the going concern concept because the parent company has agreed to provide adequate funds for the company to meet its liabilities as they fall due.

2 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting:

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Turnover:

Turnover represents the amounts invoiced, excluding Value Added Tax, in respect of the sale of goods and services to customers.

Depreciation:

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives.

Finance Leases:

Assets held under finance leases are capitalised and included as a separate category in Fixed Assets at the cost or estimated cost to the lessor. Depreciation is calculated to write off this amount on a straight line basis over the shorter of the lease term and the useful life of the assets.

Rentals payable are apportioned between the finance charge and a reduction of the outstanding obligation for future amounts payable on an actuarial basis such that the charge represents a constant proportion of the balance of capital repayments outstanding.

Operating Leases:

Rentals under operating leases are charged to income on a straight line basis over the term of the lease.

Stocks:

Stocks are stated a lower of cost and net realisable value.

Deferred Taxation:

Provision for deferred tax is made using the liability method on all timing differences only to the extent that it is probable that a liability will crystallise, calculated at the rate at which it is anticipated that the timing differences will reverse.

Foreign Currencies:

Assets, liabilities, revenues and costs expressed in foreign currencies are translated into Sterling at rates of exchange ruling on the date on which transactions occur, except for:

- (i) monetary assets and liabilities which are translated at the rate ruling at the Balance Sheet date (other than those in (ii) below); and
- (ii) transactions to be settled at a contracted rate and trading transactions covered by a related or matching forward contract which are translated at those contracted rates.

Differences arising on the translation of such items are dealt with in the Profit and Loss account.

Pensions:

Amounts paid in respect of the group personal pension scheme detailed in Note 20 to the Financial Statements are charged to the Profit and Loss Account as incurred.

Goodwill:

Goodwill represents the excess of cost of acquisitions over the fair value of the separable net assets of businesses acquired. Goodwill is written off to reserves immediately upon acquisition.

Patents and Trademarks:

Patents and Trademarks are stated at cost and are written off over their estimated useful life.

3 TURNOVER

The turnover and pre-tax result for the year are attributable to the principal activity, the design, development and manufacture of packaging equipment.
