THE REVOLVING DOORS AGENCY DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2005

The Trustees, who are Directors for the purposes of company law, present their report and audited accounts for the year ended 31st March 2005.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, applicable law and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in October 2000.

STATUS

The Revolving Doors Agency (the word 'Limited' being omitted by licence from the Department of Trade) is registered under the Companies Act 1985 as a company limited by guarantee and not having a capital divided by shares. The company is registered as a charity under registration no. 1030846.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The company's principal activity is to provide support to people with mental health problems through work with the police, criminal justice system and social, housing and health providers.

It runs experimental pan-criminal justice schemes in a number of areas in London and the South East. Link Workers provide support to mentally vulnerable offenders, research findings from the projects are used to influence service development and policy on a national level.

The company's Development Team provides training, research and evaluation and project consultancy services to other agencies across the country seeking to run similar schemes.

FUTURE ACTIVITIES

Revolving Doors Agency brings excluded members of society into the mainstream by developing the kinds of services that bridge the gap in the established structure of support.

Throughout 2004/05 the Agency has run three adult schemes in Southern Buckinghamshire, Ealing and Islington and a Young Person's Scheme, specially aimed at the 15-21 year-olds. One completed scheme in Tower Hamlets has been handed over for the long term to a local agency in London. In 2004 we launched our Prison Resettlement Skills Programme, which helps prisoners in HMP Pentonville and HMP Wormwood Scrubs develop their knowledge and skills in relation to tenancy rights and responsibilities; personal relationships; listening and presentation skills; healthy living and daily activities; and law and the criminal justice system. Those participating in this Programme also receive support from our Islington Link Workers.

Building on our success is reducing re-offending, we continue to develop flexible and innovative approaches, addressing new areas of need as they emerge.

RESERVES POLICY

It is the company's policy to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves at a level equal to approximately three months unrestricted expenditure. This provides sufficient funds to cover the proportion of staff and administration costs paid from unrestricted funds in a situation where the company would not receive any future income once the current funding programmes ends. Unrestricted funds were maintained at this level throughout the year.

DIRECTORS

The Directors in office throughout the year under review are set out on page 2. The Directors have no beneficial interest in the company other than as members. All of the Trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up. The Board has the power to appoint additional Directors.

RISKS

The Trustees have examined the major strategic, business and operational risks, which the Agency faces and confirm that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced so that the necessary steps can be taken to lessen these risks.

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

The charity's staff team currently number 26 (full-time equivalent) people working in 6 teams each with its own manager. Link Worker team managers report to the Director of Link Worker Schemes who reports, along with the Director of Partnerships, to the Chief Executive. The Chief Executive is accountable to the Agency's Board of Trustees and Directors.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The total income for the year to 31st March 2005 was £1,154,894 (£84,000 less than in the previous financial year as some of the longer term grants ended). The Agency is putting more resources into fundraising activities in the coming year to find new supporters and to renew the existing sources of income.

The charitable expenditure amounted to £1,202,123 (2.5% more than in the previous year). The management and administration expenditure was lower than last year and made up only 9 % (2004 -11%) of the total cost.

The company incurred a deficit of income over expenditure of £47,229 for the year 31st March 2005. This was due partly to the additional costs necessarily incurred in dissolving the Ealing Link Worker Scheme and partly as a result of having to employ agency staff to carry out the work in Islington. The deficit resulted in the reduction of unrestricted funds to £60,568 (2004 - £88,969) and restricted funds to £169,780 (2004 - £188,608). The restricted funds will continue to be used on specific projects as indicated in note 13 to the accounts.

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

Company law requires the Directors to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company as at the end of the financial year and of the surplus or deficit of the company for that period. In preparing those accounts, the Directors are required to:

- (a) select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- (b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- (c) follow applicable accounting standard, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts:
- (d) prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The Directors are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

CHARITABLE AND POLITICAL DONATIONS

During the year the company made no political or charitable donations.

AUDITORS

The auditors, Ramon Lee & Partners, have expressed their willingness to continue in office and a resolution for their re-appointment will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting in accordance with Section 385 of the Companies Act 1985

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2005

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of accounts

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the charity's operations, which are described in the Directors' and Trustees' Report and all of which are continuing.

The accounts have been prepared in compliance with the revised Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities".

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement.

1.2 TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation.

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write of the cost or valuation of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Equipment

- 33 1/3% on cost

Short leasehold improvements

over period of lease

1.3 GRANTS

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable. Revenue grants received in the year which relate to future accounting periods have been carried forward as deferred income as part of creditors.

1.4 TAXATION

Value Added Tax is not recoverable by the charity, and, as such, is included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.

The company is a registered charity and, therefore, is not liable for Income Tax or Corporation Tax on income derived from charitable activities, as it falls within the various exemptions available to registered charities.

1.5 EXPENDITURE OF MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE CHARITY

Administration expenditure includes all expenditure not directly related to the charitable activity. This includes costs of renting and running office premises, staff salaries for administrative staff and audit fees.

1.6 PENSION CONTRIBUTIONS

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme on behalf of its staff. Contributions are paid to an insured scheme and are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are payable. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. The pension costs charged in the accounts represent the contributions payable by the charity during the year in accordance with FRS 17.

The funding for individual projects included in restricted funds are detailed below:

Central Support – this includes both central statutory and charitable funding to help fund the Senior Management Team and the core costs of the Agency. This funding lasts between one and two years beyond the balance sheet date.

South Bucks Link Worker – this includes both funding from both Central and Local statutory sources, to support the Link Worker scheme based in South Buckinghamshire, and lasts between one and two years beyond the balance sheet date.

Islington Link Worker – this includes funding from Central and Local statutory sources as well as charitable sources, to support the Link Worker and related housing schemes based in Islington, and lasts between one and two years beyond the balance sheet date.

13. RESTRICTED FUNDS (Cont/d)

Tower Hamlets Link Worker – this includes funding from Central and Local statutory sources, to support the Link Worker Scheme based in Tower Hamlets, and lasts between one and two years beyond the balance sheet date.

Development Team Unit – this includes funding from Central statutory and charitable sources, to support the work of the Agency's Development team to spread the knowledge and experience of the Agency throughout England and Wales, and lasts between one and two years beyond the balance sheet date.

Policy and Communication - this includes funding from central statutory and charitable sources to support the work of the Agency's Development Team to disseminate the learning of the Agency to policy and opinion makers and media throughout England and Wales and lasts between one and two years beyond the balance sheet date.

Ealing Link Worker – this includes funding from Central and Local statutory sources as well as charitable sources, to support the Link Worker and related housing schemes based in Ealing. The Scheme was discontinued during the year.

Young People's Scheme – this includes funding from Central and Local statutory sources as well as charitable sources, to support the development of new Young People's Link Worker schemes in London and the South East, and lasts between one and three years beyond the balance sheet date.

User Involvement – this is funded by charitable trusts to support the work of Revolvers Group. The funding lasts between one and two years beyond balance sheet date.

14. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

No Trustee received any remuneration during the year (2004 - £nil). One trustee was reimbursed travel expenses totalling £814. (2004 – One trustee was reimbursed travel expenses of £485).
