The company's principal activity during the year and for the foreseeable future is that of a holding company for a group of companies engaged in property development and trading

On 6 March 2012, the company entered into an agreement to lend £3,000,000 to Cathedral (Greenwich Beach) Limited, a company incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales, to acquire a property in London

The company is a designated member in Purplexed LLP, currently involved in a mixed-use development in Hayes, London

On 21 February 2013, the company received interim dividends for the year ended 28 February 2013 of £60,000 per ordinary share representing income of £6,000,000 from DS Property Developments Limited

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 28 February 2013

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

These financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 2006, and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards and under the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with the previous period.

Going concern

The directors have prepared the financial statements on the going concern basis, on the grounds that the company can meet its liabilities as they fall due

Consolidated financial statements

The financial statements present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not as a group. Under the exemption provided by Financial Reporting Standard number 2, consolidated financial statements are not prepared as the company is itself a wholly owned subsidiary of Development Securities PLC, a company registered in England and Wales which prepares consolidated financial statements in which the results of the company and its subsidiaries are included and which are publicly available.

Cash flow statement and related party disclosures

The company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Development Securities PLC and is included in the consolidated financial statements of Development Securities PLC, which are publicly available Consequently, the company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard number 1 "Cash flow statements" (revised 1996) The company is also exempt under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard number 8 "Related party disclosures" from disclosing related party transactions with wholly-owned entities that are part of the Development Securities PLC group

Turnover

Development management fee income and asset management fee income, which excludes value added tax, are recognised as services are provided

Taxation

Current tax, including United Kingdom corporation tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

Deferred taxation is provided in full on timing differences that result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, at a future date, at rates expected to apply when they crystallise based on current tax rates and law. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in financial statements. Deferred tax is not provided on timing differences arising from the revaluation of fixed assets where there is no binding contract to dispose of these assets. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Investments in subsidiaries

The shares in subsidiaries shown in the balance sheet of the company are included at cost less any deficits arising from diminutions in value considered to be permanent, which are charged to the profit and loss account

As announced in the March 2012 Budget, the main rate of UK corporation tax was reduced to 24% from 1 April 2012 and 23% from 1 April 2013. The reductions were substantively enacted at the balance sheet date and, therefore recognised in these financial statements.

Further reductions to the UK corporation tax rate were announced in the March 2013 Budget. The changes, which are expected to be enacted separately each year, propose to reduce the rate to 21% from 1 April 2014, followed by a further 1% reduction to 20% by 1 April 2015. The changes had not been substantively enacted at the balance sheet date and, therefore, are not recognised in these financial statements.
