1. Accounting Policies

a. Accounting Convention

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

b. Service Payments

The service payments receivable under the standard lease are payable on 29th September in each year. Only those payments that relate to the particular periods expenditure are included. The service payment due 29th September 2000 is not included as it represents a contribution to the following years expenditure.
