REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2001

The directors and trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2001.

1. OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY, PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND ORGANISATION OF OUR WORK

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee, and is therefore governed by a memorandum and articles of association.

The main activities of the company are principally to promote the preservation of mental health and to assist in relieving and rehabilitating persons suffering from mental disorders or conditions of emotional or mental distress.

The trustees have a responsibility to ensure that all the aspects of the charities' activities are properly conducted and carried out in full compliance with the memorandum and articles of association.

2. DEVELOPMENT, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS THIS YEAR

Both the level of activity and the year end financial position were satisfactory, and the directors expect that the present level of activity will be sustained for the foreseeable future.

3. TRANSACTIONS AND FINANCIAL POSITION

The statement of financial activities shows net cash income for the year of £46,017, and our unrestricted reserves stand at £305,032 in total.

Also included in debtors is £27,000 relating to funds due for the year but not dispersed as at the year end.

4. TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS FOR USE BY THE CHARITY

Details of movements in fixed assets are set out in note 13 to the accounts. In the opinion of the Trustees, the improvements to leasehold property are not valued at a materially different sum from the original cost shown in the accounts.

### 5. FUNDS AVAILABLE

The present level of funding is adequate to support the continuation of all facilities now in operation for the medium term, and the trustees consider the financial position of the charity to be satisfactory.

#### 6. DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES

All directors of the company are also trustees of the charity, and there are no other trustees. All of the trustees named on page 1 (except where indicated) served throughout the year. The Board has the power to appoint additional trustees as it considers fit to do so.

#### 7. TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the Charities Act 1993, the trustees are required to prepare a statement of account for each financial year which gives a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of its incoming resources and application of resources in the year. In preparing the statement the trustees are required to:

- a) select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- c) state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- d) prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the charity will continue its operations.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable the trustees to ensure that the financial statements comply with the requirements of the Charities Act 1993 and regulation 3 of the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 1995. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

### RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES AND AUDITORS

As described on page 4, the charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those financial statements and to report our opinion to you. We have been appointed as auditors under section 43 of the Charities Act 1993 and report in accordance with regulations made under section 44 of that Act.

#### BASIS OF OPINION

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes an examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the judgements made by the trustees in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charity's circumstances, consistently applied and properly disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or by other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

#### **OPINION**

### NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2001

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of accounts

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the charity's operations which are described in the Directors' and Trustees' Report and all of which are continuing.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and follow recommendations in Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting by Charities.

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement on the grounds that it qualifies as a small company.

1.2 Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity are stated at cost less depreciation.

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Freehold buildings 4 ) straight line Furniture, fixtures and fittings 25 ) basis

#### 1.3 Income

Voluntary income and donations are accounted for as received by the charity. The income from fund raising ventures is shown gross, with the associated costs included in fundraising costs. No permanent endowments have been received in the period. Grants are accounted for when received.



NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2001 (CONTINUED)

### 1.4 Investments

Investments are stated at market value. Realised and unrealised gains and losses on investments are dealt with in the Statement of Financial Activities. Investment income plus associated tax recoverable is credited to income on an accruals basis, using dates of payment for dividends, and daily accrual for interest.

#### 1.5 Value added tax

Value added tax is not recoverable by the charity, and as such is included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.

#### 1.6 Finance leases

Assets obtained under finance leases are capitalised as tangible fixed assets. Depreciation is charged over the shorter of the length of the lease and the estimated useful life of the asset. Finance leases are those where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership are assumed by the charity. Obligations under such leases are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of each payment is charged to the Statement of Financial Activities so as to produce a constant periodic rate on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

#### 1.7 Operating leases

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are reflected in the Statement of Financial Activities as incurred.

## 1.8 Fundraising costs

Fundraising expenditure comprises costs incurred in inducing people and organisations to contribute financially to the charity's work. This includes the cost of advertising for donations and the staging of special fundraising events.

## 1.9 Management and administration expenditure

Expenditure on management and administration of the charity includes all expenditure not directly related to the charitable activity or fundraising ventures. This includes cost of renting and running office premises, staff salaries for administrative staff and audit fees.

## 1.10 Capital grants received

SSAP4 requires capital grants to be released to the statement of financial activities over the period of the life of the related asset. The same policy is applied to the Anchor House Appeal Fund.

#### 1.11 Services

Certain services are delivered through dedicated outlets. The expenses of these services which are reimbursed from Central, are included in the statement of financial activities. The income and expenditure under the direct control of the service are not included in the statement of financial activities but are included in the individual income and expenditure accounts produced for each service on pages 20 to 23. The bank and cash balances of the individual services are included in the balance sheet.

#### 1.12 Taxation

No provision has been made for corporation tax as the charity is a registered charity and is therefore exempt.

### 1.13 Pension contributions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme and amounts are charged to the statement of financial activities as they are paid.
