The Directors present their report together with the audited financial statements for the Company for the year ended 31 December 2009

Principal activities

The Company owns the Dunhill tobacco trademarks, which it licenses to fellow British American Tobacco p I c Group (the "Group") companies around the world

Review of the year to 31 December 2009

The profit for the financial year attributable to Dunhill Tobacco of London Limited shareholders after deduction of all charges and the provision of tax amounted to £46,830,000 (2008 £43,061,000)

The Directors expect the Company's activities to continue on a similar basis in the foreseeable future

Key performance indicators

The Directors of British American Tobacco plc, the ultimate parent company, manage the operations of the Group on a regional basis. For this reason, and given the nature of the Company's activities, the Company's Directors believe that key performance indicators are not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the Company's specific development, performance or the position of its business. However, key performance indicators relevant to the Group, and which may be relevant to the Company, are disclosed in the Business Review section in the Annual Report of British American Tobacco plc and do not form part of this report.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The principal risks and uncertainties of the Company, including financial risk management, are integrated with the principal risks of the Group and are monitored by audit committees to provide a framework for identifying, evaluating and managing risks faced by the Group Accordingly, the key Group risk factors that may be relevant to the Company are disclosed in the Annual Report of British American Tobacco p I c and do not form part of this report

1 Accounting policies

A summary of the principal accounting policies is set out below

(1) Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom

(2) Cash flow statement

The Company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of British American Tobacco p I c The cash flows of the Company are included in the consolidated cash flow statement of British American Tobacco p I c which is publicly available Consequently the Company is exempt under the terms of FRS 1 (Revised) from publishing a cash flow statement

(3) Foreign currencies

Transactions arising in currencies other than sterling are translated at the rate of exchange ruling on the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities expressed in currencies other than sterling are translated at rates of exchange ruling at the end of the financial year. All exchange differences are taken to the profit and loss account in the year.

(4) Accounting for income

Income comprises sales at invoiced value and is included in the profit and loss account when all contractual or other applicable conditions for recognition have been met. Provisions are made for bad and doubtful debts where there is an expectation that all or a portion of the amount due will not be reviewed.

(5) Taxation

Taxation provided is that chargeable on the profits of the year, together with deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis

(6) Intangible fixed assets

Trademarks and licences are stated at cost, less any amounts provided for impairment in value No annual amortisation is charged in respect of these assets except where the end of the useful economic lives of the assets can be foreseen. The useful economic lives and the carrying value are reviewed annually and any amortisation or provision for impairment in value charged in the profit and loss account.

1 Accounting policies (continued)

(7) Dividends

Dividends payable that are unapproved at the year end are not recognised as a liability. Similarly, dividend income is recognised at the same time as the paying company recognises the liability to pay a dividend
