NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 1995

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of Preparation of Accounts

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the company's operations which are described in the Directors Report and all of which are continuing.

The company has taken advantage of the exemptions in Financial Reporting Standard No.1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

(b) <u>Turnover</u>

Turnover represents fees received from services provided, excluding Value Added Tax.

(c) Depreciation

Tangible Fixed Assets are depreciated at rates designed to write off the costs over their estimated useful lives. These rates are calculated as follows:-

Equipment Motor Vehicle

15% p.a. on written down value 20% p.a. on written down value

(d) Leasing and Hire Purchase

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible fixed assets. Assets acquired by finance lease are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Assets acquired by hire purchase are depreciated over their useful lives. Finance leases are those where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership are assumed by the company. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

(e) Operating Leases

Rentals applicable to operating leases were substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged to profit and loss account as incurred.

(f) Stocks and Work in Progress

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving stocks. Cost includes all direct costs and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

(g) Pension Costs

The company pension scheme operates on the basis of defined contributions and the charge to the profit and loss account therefore reflects contributions payable in the accounting period.
