1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

CCS Mobile Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities" of Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis which assumes that the company will continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future which the directors consider to be appropriate.

Reconciliation with previous generally accepted accounting practice

These financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2017 are the first financial statements that comply with FRS 102 Section 1a "Small Entities" - "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland". The date of transition is 1 April 2015. In preparing the financial statements, the directors have considered whether in applying the accounting policies required by FRS102 Section 1a "Small Entities", the restatement of comparative items was required. The transition to FRS102 Section 1a "Small Entities" has resulted in a small number of changes in accounting policies to those previously used. There were no transitional adjustments required.

Turnover

Turnover represents net sales of goods, excluding value added tax.

Goodwill

Goodwill, being the amount paid in connection with the acquisition of a business, is being amortised evenly over its estimated useful life of twenty five years.

Computer software

The directors are not able to reliably estimate the useful life term of the asset, therefore they consider that an amortisation period of 10 years is appropriate and in accordance with guidance provided by generally accepted accounting practice.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Freehold property - 1% on cost

Improvements to property

- 10% on reducing balance
Fixtures and fittings
- 20% on reducing balance
Motor vehicles
- 25% on reducing balance

Stocks

Stock is valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value. Cost is determined on a first in first out basis. Net realisable value represents estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Provision is made for slow moving, obsolete and damaged stock where the net realisable value is less than cost.

Financial instruments

The company only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value.

Taxation

Taxation for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Income Statement, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the statement of financial position date.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the statement of financial position date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the year end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

The interest element of these obligations is charged to profit or loss over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability.

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to profit or loss in the period to which they relate.

Technical fund balances

In accordance with usual company policy, client entitlement to all credits, credit balances and/or kit funds or any other entitlements will automatically cease and be recognised as company income under any of the following conditions; the agreement expiring, termination of the agreement signed through the company but not fulfilled through the company, the client terminating their relationship with the company or leaving the designated network before completion of the agreed term
