Organisation, Structure and Governance

Governing document

The Trevor Jones Tetraplegic Trust was created as a charity in 1988 and was incorporated on 17 December 1993 when it was registered with the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales as Charity no 1030693. In order to reflect accurately the work and scope of the Trust, the name was changed to Regain - the Trust for Sports Tetraplegics ("Regain") on 19 May 1995. Regain is the only charitable organisation dedicated solely to improving the independence of all British men and women who have become tetraplegic as a result of a competitive sports or leisure injury.

Regain is a company limited by guarantee governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 17 December 1993

Appointment of Trustees

We have appointed one secretary and eight Trustees Trustees are selected to give an appropriate range of skills and experience, and are recruited by personal contact or by using Reach (www Reachskills org uk) New Trustees are introduced to the other Trustees at one of our quarterly meetings and if considered suitable appointed at that meeting

Trustee induction and training

Newly appointed Trustees are inducted by existing Trustees. The Company Secretary sends to all new Trustees the latest governance information produced by the Charity Commission which outlines their responsibilities and duties as a Trustee.

Organisation

The board of Trustees administers the charitable company. They meet quarterly to make the operational decisions The day-to-day running of the charitable company is delegated to Roger Belson, the Company Secretary

Each member (who is not necessarily a Trustee) has undertaken to contribute to the assets of the company in the event of the same being wound up while she/he is a member, or within one year of ceasing to be a member, for payment of debts and liabilities of the company contracted before ceasing to be a member, and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up, and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributors amongst themselves, such amount as may be required not exceeding £1

Objectives and activities

Regain's objectives are

- 1 To relieve individuals who, as a result of an accident in a sporting activity, have suffered spinal injury, resulting in the complete loss of use of two limbs, the serious impairment of function in the remaining limbs, and the significant loss of personal mobility without human or mechanical assistance
- 2 To improve the conditions of life of those individuals who have suffered injuries as defined above by the provision of resources or equipment
- To advance the education of the public and in particular the knowledge of spinal injuries which may be suffered by individuals participating in sporting activities?

Regain aims to

- Help all British sports tetraplegics lead an independent life
- Provide equipment to improve the mobility, independence and quality of life of all British sports tetraplegics
- Forge long-term relationships with British sports tetraplegics and their families so they feel support for the rest of their lives financially, as far as possible, and in terms of expert advice and professional counselling
- Provide, where possible, free consultation in areas of legal, financial, insurance, medical and counselling
- Be a forum for British sports tetraplegics to share their experiences, and possibly their lives, with other sports tetraplegics
- Develop a self-help program to foster their sense of worth and belonging
- Seek employment and occupational opportunities for sports tetraplegics
- Increase awareness of the risks of sports tetraplegia with the aim of reducing the number of accidents
- Increase awareness of the need to insure against the risks of tetraplegia among sporting bodies and sportsmen and women generally
- Actively ensure equal opportunities for all tetraplegics, including women and ethnic minorities who
 face additional disadvantages

The strategies employed to achieve the charitable company's objectives are kept under review

The main activities of the charitable company are arranging with Action for Charity fundraising events to support our many grant applications

Public benefit statement

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit, 'Charities and Public Benefit'

Procedure and policy for grant making

The first action an applicant takes is to complete an application form (available from our web site) and send it to the Company Secretary. The application is reviewed, the applicant spoken to by the Company Secretary and an assessment is made. If the application complies with our objectives and remit then the Company Secretary seeks authority from the Trustees (at the next Trustees meeting) to make funds available to support the application. The grant is used to pay the supplier direct and not given to the tetraplegic applicant. All grants paid in the year were for the benefit of individuals.

Achievements and performance

The overall aim of the Trust remains to achieve the maximum independence and quality of life for all male and female sports tetraplegics, whatever their age

During the course of the year the number of sports tetraplegics associated with Regain has exceeded 250 Requests for equipment continue to be received at the rate of approximately three per month. The amount of income needed to fund specialist equipment varies from year to year, but in 2009 stood at £110,000. This money can only be raised from members of the public or charitable organisations, and we are most grateful for their continued support. Our three annual fund-raising events are the primary source of net income for Regain.

The year began with another very successful London Marathon event. Five runners raised nearly £6,000 between them. We are most grateful to the runners for their determination to raise so much sponsorship. This was followed shortly afterwards by our ninth annual running of the very successful Snowdonia. Challenge Event, when 50 teams of 4 raised the amazing sum of £76,000. The teams are required to cycle, climb and canoe around Snowdonia.

In June we organised our ninth Regain Sports Awards Lunch, at the Intercontinental Hotel, Park Lane Over 30 tetraplegics attended with their carers, and had a thoroughly enjoyable time mixing with some of our sponsors and other able-bodied people who had taken part in some of our fund-raising events Over 180 people attended, and despite it not being a fundraising event we managed to make a profit of £6,000

Action for Charity organised one overseas cycling event for Regain to Vietnam and Cambodia. This was at times a very difficult ride due to the heat and humidity. None the less this was a very successful event raising £87,000. Over 40 able bodied people took part along with six tetraplegics and their carers. This was definitely the highlight of the year for those tetraplegics who took part.

We were also very fortunate enough to receive £9,000 in donations. With all the money we raised we paid out £130,000 on grants to 45 tetraplegies in need of equipment etc.

The Trust's website (www regainsportscharity com) has continued to be developed during the year and provides a wealth of information, not only about Tetraplegia and the activities of the Trust, but also education on the potential risks of spinal injuries which may be suffered by individuals participating in sporting events

The Board of Trustees would like to record its appreciation to all supporters of Regain, whose help is so essential to the continued success of the Trust. Our particular thanks go to Gay Bentley-Coleman and Ann Frampton of Action for Charity whose enthusiasm and dedication to the Charity knows no bounds, and to Penny Cole our bookkeeper

Plans for the future

Fundraising events in 2010 and 2011 will follow the established pattern. The annual Snowdonia Challenge will continue, as will the annual overseas events (India in 2010, and a planned European event in 2011). The annual lunch took place at the Intercontinental Hotel in May 2010, and plans are well advanced for the 2011 lunch at the same venue.

The initiative to recruit outreach volunteers to visit all the UK spinal units on a regular basis to promote our work and see if any inpatients need our support commenced in 2009, and is being developed and enhanced

Financial review

Total income received during the year was £397,455 compared with £317,761 in the previous year to 31 December 2008

Costs of generating funds amounted to £223,838 (2008 - £181,080), expenditure on charitable activities to £108,356 (2008 - £156,207) and governance costs to £10,715 (2008 - £10,235) This has given rise to a surplus for the year of £54,546 compared to a deficit of £29,761 in the previous year This surplus has been added to reserves which now stand at £153,844 (2008 - £99,298) A Trustees meeting was held in January 2010 at which grants amounting to £34,562 were approved

Investment and reserves policy

The Trustees have the power to invest any funds not required for immediate use on deposit or invest as they see fit

The Trustee's policy is to maintain a level of reserves which will provide a stable base for the charitable company's continuing activities while at the same time ensuring that reserves are not accumulated.

The reserves policy has been reviewed by the Trustees and they have concluded that the reserves should be set at approximately £100,000 in order to provide a stable base, and to take account of the timing of receipts and grant applications. The unrestricted reserves at 31 December 2009 amounted to £153,844 (2008 - £99,298)

Risk management

The Trustees have been addressing the risk areas to which they believe the Charity may be exposed, and two Trustees are considering the most appropriate ways to mitigate those risks

Auditors

Saffery Champness were appointed auditors to the company and in accordance with section 485 of the Companies Act 2006, a resolution proposing that they be re-appointed will be put at a General Meeting

Trustee's responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

The Trustees (who are also Directors for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

Company law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure of the charitable company for that period In preparing these financial statements, the Trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP,
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements,
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Charitable Company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the corporate and financial information included on the charitable company's website. Legislation in the United Kingdom governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charitable company is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable certainty. The following specific policies apply to categories of income

Any income from fundraising is shown gross

Donations and grants are included in incoming resources when the charitable company has certainity of entitlement to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy Entitlement is the earlier of the charitable company being notified of an impending donation or grant or the funds being received

1.3 Resources expended

Resources expended are included in the statement of financial activities on an accruals basis, inclusive of VAT, which cannot be recovered

Certain expenditure is directly attributable to specific activities and has been included in those cost categories. Certain overhead expenditure (as shown in note 5) has been apportioned on the basis of the estimated time spent by staff on the three main activities of the charitable company.

Grants payable are charged in the year when the offer is conveyed to the recipient

Fundraising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and other income generation, for example, the costs associated with promoting and running the events

Governance costs are the costs associated with the governance arrangements of the charitable company, which relate to the general running of the charitable company as opposed to those costs associated with fundraising or charitable activity. Included within this category are costs associated with the strategic as opposed to day-to-day management of the charitable company's activities.

1.4 Accumulated funds

Funds held by the charitable company are:

Unrestricted funds - these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable company's objects, at the discretion of the Board

1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. The costs of minor additions or those costing less than £1,000 are not capitalised. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows
