Directors' report for the year ended 31 December 1997

The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 1997.

Principal Activities

During the year the company continued activities as an investment company in the UK cable communications industry.

Review of business and future development

The profit and loss account for the year is set out on page 5. During the year an interim dividend was paid on the fixed rate cumulative redeemable preference shares. No ordinary dividend is proposed (1996: £Nil). The directors recommend that the retained profit of £330,304 (1996: £183,087) be transferred to reserves.

The Company intends to continue its principal activities for the foreseeable future.
