TRUSTEES' AND DIRECTORS' REPORT

The trustees and directors present their annual report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2000.

Name and nature of the charity

The Hampshire Foundation for Young Musicians is a company limited by guarantee and is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

The Foundation is registered in the United Kingdom, Company Registration number 2891871 and Registered Charity number 1032598.

The Foundation's principal activity is to advance the education in music of young people under the age of 25.

Trustees and directors of the Foundation 1999/00

The trustees and directors of the Foundation for the financial year 1999/00 were as follows:

The current directors are also members of the Foundation. Each member undertakes to contribute a sum, not exceeding £1, to the assets of the Foundation in the event of it being wound up.

Statement of directors' responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of any surplus or deficit of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently

make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent

prepare financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Address of principal and registered office of the Foundation

The Foundation's registered office is The Castle, Winchester, Hampshire SO23 8UJ.

Bankers

The Foundation's banking arrangements are dealt through the County Council's own bank account, which during 1999/00 was held with Lloyds TSB Bank plc. With effect from 1 June 2000 the County Council's bank account will be held with National Westminster Bank plc.

Company Secretary and Solicitor

The Foundation's Company Secretary and Solicitor is Simon Whitbourn MA (Cantab) Dip. LG of The Castle, Winchester, Hampshire.

Auditors

In relation to the financial year 1999/00, the Foundation qualifies as a small company that can be exempt from the annual statutory audit. In accordance with the Companies Act Section 379A the Foundation can dispense with the obligation to appoint auditors annually.

Objects of the Charity

The objects of the Foundation are contained in the Foundation's Memorandum of Association.

The Foundation's principal objects are to advance the education in music of children and young persons up to the age of 25 who reside in the County of Hampshire, including the cities of Portsmouth and Southampton or who are educated principally in the schools and colleges within the said County.

Organisation of the Foundation

The Foundation is a company limited by guarantee with a Board of Directors who are also the trustees of the Foundation and the members of the Foundation.

The Board of Directors has met on four occasions during the year and provides a general overview on policy and reviews the activities of the Foundation.

The Foundation is administered on a day to day basis by the Chief Executive/Administrator who is assisted by part-time seconded staff from the County Council's Music Service. In addition, the Foundation is supported by staff from the Chief Executive's and County Treasurer's Departments of the County Council.

Review of the year

The following awards were made in the financial year ended 31 March 2000:

Guy Button to assist with the cost of studying violin and piano as a boarding pupil at the Purcell School, Hertfordshire - £500.

Rebecca Filkin to assist with the cost of studying cello and piano at the Royal College of Music on a part-time basis - £250.

Michael Gale to assist with the cost of studying Historical Musicology at King's College London - £500.

Hannah Grayson to assist with the cost of studying the flute at the Royal Academy of Music on a part-time basis - £250.

Winchester Area Schools Orchestra to assist with the cost of a residential weekend in the New Forest - £200.

Katie Bedford, flautist with the National Youth Orchestra, to assist with the cost of attending NYO residential courses - £225.

Katherine Butler to assist with the cost of attending the International Handbell Symposium in Birmingham in August 2000 - £300.

Alison Griffiths, harpist with the National Youth Orchestra, to assist with the cost of attending residential courses - £225.

Edward Stutters to assist with the cost of private tuition for playing the French horn - £300.

Review of transactions and financial position

Attached to this report are the Foundation's annual accounts for the financial year ended 31 March 2000. The notes to the accounts provide an explanation of the salient features of the accounts.

The accounts show that the Foundation will carry forward reserves of £66,778. This is lower than the opening reserve balance of £72,525. This reflects a deficit for the year of £5,747 transferred from the income and expenditure account. £4,911 of this deficit resulted from a final depreciation charge on the musical instruments owned by the Foundation. The remainder reflects an excess of grants and administration costs over interest received on the Foundation's investments.

The Foundation's assets

The financial statements attached to this report provide a detailed assessment of the Foundation's assets as at 31 March 2000. Details of fixed assets are set out in note 10 to the financial statements.

Relationship with charities and other organisations

The Foundation's main relationship is now split equally between Hampshire County Council and the two unitary authorities being Portsmouth and Southampton.

The Foundation continues to seek funding from local authorities, charitable organisations and other organisations from which funds may be forthcoming.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

Year ended 31 March 2000

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting for Charities". The particular accounting policies adopted are described below.

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

Turnover

Turnover represents all forms of income, including grant income and donations, but excluding interest receivable.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets over their effective useful lives in equal instalments. The rates of depreciation used have been as follows:

Equipment

- 25%

Instruments

- 25%

The equipment and instruments have now been written out of the balance sheet entirely.

Taxation

The company has been granted charitable status and is therefore not liable to corporation tax on its charitable income.

Direct charitable expenditure

Direct charitable expenditure represents the direct cost of supporting charitable activities and projects, including management and administration costs.
