## Notes to the abbreviated accounts

#### 1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting by Charities" and applicable accounting standards.

#### Company status

Yorkshire and Humberside Business in the Arts is a company limited by guarantee. The liability in respect of the guarantee, as set out in the memorandum, is limited to £1 a member. The company has availed itself of paragraph 3(3) of Schedule 4 of the Companies Act 1985 and adapted the Companies Act formats to reflect the special nature of the company's activities.

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources during the year have been recognised in the statement of financial activities as they are earned and when realised in the form of cash or other assets, the ultimate cash realisation of which can be assessed with reasonable certainty.

Grants have been included in accordance with the conditions of the grant and are credited to income in the year to which they relate.

All incoming resources relate to unrestricted funds.

#### Direct charitable expenditure

Direct charitable expenses are separately allocated and comprise all expenditure directly relating to the objects of the charity including the direct costs of supporting charitable activities and projects.

#### Expenditure

Expenditure comprises publicity costs and expenditure on the management and administration of the company.

#### Fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation provided at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life. The rate applied is as follows:

Office equipment

15% - 20% per annum

#### Taxation

Yorkshire and Humberside Business in the Arts claims an exemption due to its charitable status.
