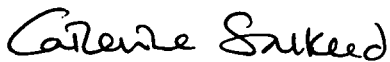

Statement of directors' responsibilities in respect of the Directors' Report and the financial statements

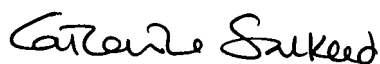
