The trustees present their annual report with the accounts of the company for the year ended March 31,2013

Principal Activity

The principle activity of the company in the year under review was that of a registered charity (No 1067193)

Aims and Objectives

The overall aim is to provide volunteering infrastructure support to organisations and volunteers wanting information, advice and support with regard to volunteering. In addition we will work in partnership with other organisations to establish services which meet the needs of the community in Buxton and its surrounding area.

We will

- advise and guide persons willing to undertake voluntary service
- act as a central recruiting agency for voluntary and statutory organisations
- be a focal point for organisations using volunteers, encouraging the exchange of ideas and promoting specific projects when needed
- provide an information service for prospective volunteers, giving them advice, guidance and referring them to the most appropriate agency
- provide a central information service for organisations to discuss the role of volunteers and their training, and undertake with other organisations the running of necessary courses

Please note the above is a selection from and not a comprehensive list of our aims and objectives as contained in our constitution

Review of the Years Activities

Staffing and services have remained the same through the year, however we are aware that funding from the Big Lottery BASIS fund finished at the end of March and we successfully applied for Supporting Change money to help us plan how we deliver volunteering in the future. Our aim as always to minimise the impact on the community. The volunteer coordinator based at the centre continued to deliver passport training for young volunteers for Derbyshire County Council and this year this has been developed for volunteers who volunteer with older people. There is a constant demand for advice and support for people wanting to volunteer

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH,2013 (CONTINUED)

In partnership with Peaks and Dales Advocacy we have provided placements for three social work students, two full time and one part time, all of whom have passed their first year

Children's Service are providing one to one flexible support to disabled children and young people in Chesterfield and High Peak and group support in the High Peak. In partnership with Stockport CP we have run 6 Parent Support Groups through the year. All these services have been funded by Derbyshire County Council. Home Support has continued to develop its pop in rounds and we also bid for work through the Brokerage service at the County Council. We have received a good report from the Care Quality Commission. We have also been able to support children and adults through the direct payment and spot contract route.

The number of transport journeys has increased this year. We had a long period of bad weather and our transport service not only supported people in still accessing appointments but also supported our Home Support Service to ensure no-one missed out on the care they needed

We also managed to get people emergency shopping when they couldn't get out and shop for themselves, and phoned our older service users who live on their own to ensure they were managing during the winter weather. We had funding from Derbyshire County Council to assist us in providing this support

Readycall Home Maintenance has recruited 2 new employees for the Readycall service, service delivery is very dependent on consistency of bank staff and we lost one key member this year

High Peak Handy Van role is now a job share and continues achieving the targets. We continue to employ a full time operative in the Derbyshire Dales and we are installing and servicing a large amount of Telecare equipment in this area.

Over this last year our Cleaning service has continued to grow At this year end we have 26 clients in Buxton, Chapel and New Mills, and aim to continue this growth in the future

Governing Document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee which re-registered as Volunteer Centre Buxton and District on 24th May 2006 previously registered as Buxton Volunteer Bureau The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association

Recruitment and Appointment of Management Committee

The directors of the company are charity trustees for the purposes of charity law and under the Company's Articles are known as members of the Management Committee. The members of the Committee are elected for a period of three years after which they must be re-elected at the next AGM.

Trustee Induction and Training

All Trustees are familiar with the work of the Volunteer Centre as many have been directly involved through their volunteering work. Newly recruited Trustees meet the Chair of the organisation and attend a short training session with the Chief Officer which covers

- learning about the organisation and its aims and objectives, finding out about the various projects we run and meeting the staff involved in these projects
- being given a Trustees task description and the last 2 years annual reports including finances, future plans and developments. This information is supported by the provision of a Volunteer Centre Trustee Handbook with the relevant information provided and ongoing information from the Charity Commission etc.

Volunteer Centre Buxton Mission Statement is:

"To provide information and support to prospective volunteers and organisations needing volunteers and to enhance the quality of life for people in Buxton and the surrounding areas through the provision of services"

Reserves Policy

Reserves are kept to ensure the Centre continues to meet its legal obligations to its staff, many of whom are long serving and also the members of the community to who we provide services. It is agreed that the Volunteer Centre aims to have 3 months running costs kept in reserve to ensure the Centre is able to meet its obligations

Free reserves are £100,927, this represents approximately 1 ½ months expenditure based on 2012/13 expenditure

This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure it keeps abreast of developments within the Centre

Risk assessment

The Trustees have identified the major risks to which the charity is exposed and the strategies in place to manage those risks

Financial Review

The future funding position continues to be uncertain due to constraints on local and central government funding. The trustees will continue to aim to reduce the reliance on grant funding by seeking to generate funds from service delivery.

Future Developments

We have been aware that our funding streams have depleted and have looked for solutions in ensuring we maintain our key services which people heavily rely on. With this in mind representatives from our Board have been meeting with representatives from Volunteer. Centre Derbyshire Dales with the aim of exploring the idea of a merger between the two organisations. The merger sub group has sought legal and financial advice, consulted its key funders and stakeholders and the result is that Volunteer Centre Derbyshire Dales and Volunteer Centre Buxton and district merged on October 1st 2013 creating a new organisation "Voluntary and Community Services Peaks and Dales". There will still be a local base in both areas and the two Chief Officers will job share. The aim will be that all services will continue to be delivered by both organisations and new services will be developed.

Organisational Structure

The Board meets bi-monthly and also has a strategic management sub group which meets as and when required with other working groups convened when necessary

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Standard for Small Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and follow the recommendations in "Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Practice" revised in October 2005

Donations and legacies

Donations are legacies are recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities when they become receivable, that is where it is reasonably certain that they will be received and where the value can be measured with sufficient reliability

Grants

Revenue grants are accounted for on an accruals basis and are included in the period in which the related expenditure is incurred

Resources expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activates on an accruals basis, inclusive of any VAT, which cannot be recovered

Expenditure is recognised when a liability is incurred

- Charitable activities includes expenditure associated with the provision the Volunteer Centre Services and includes both the direct costs and support costs of delivering those services
- Governance costs include those incurred in the governance of the charity and its assets and are primarily associated with constituted and statutory activities
- Support costs include central functions and premises costs and are allocated according to activity

Fund accounting

Funds held by the charity are either

- Unrestricted general funds these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees
- Designated funds these are funds set aside by the trustees out of unrestricted general funds for specific future purposes or projects
- Restricted funds these are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows

Computer Equipment

- 33 1/3% on cost

Office Equipment

- 10% on cost

Motor Vehicles

- 25% on cost

Individual assets costing less than £1,000 are not usually capitalised

Pension costs

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme for certain employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the charitable company. The annual contributions payable are charged to the income and expenditure account.

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profit on a straight line basis over the period of the lease
