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Directors' Report for the year ended 31 December 2005

The directors present their annual report, together with the audited financial statements of the company and the group, for the year ended 31 December 2005.

Principal Activity

The principal activity of the group is the design, manufacture and sale of underfloor heating products.

Results and Dividends

The results for the year are set out on page 5. The profit for the year after taxation was £8,864. The results show satisfactory growth in turnover, which is a trend that the directors expect to continue for the foreseeable future.

The directors do not recommend payment of a final dividend.

Research and Development

The company is not involved in any research and development activities.

Purchase of Company's Own Shares

Warmup PLC repurchased 42,366 of its ordinary £1 shares on 16 August 2005, representing a total of 10.63% of the total called-up share capital. The aggregate consideration paid was £423,660. The shares were acquired from the retiring director Mr J W Glendinning.

Payments of Creditors

Creditors are paid according to the terms that are agreed in the ordinary course of business. Trade creditors of the company at 31 December 2005 were equivalent to 77 days purchases based on an average daily amount invoiced by suppliers during the period (2004: 29 days).

1. Accounting Policies

1.1. Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

1.2. Basis of Consolidation

The group financial statements consolidate the accounts of Warmup PLC and all its subsidiary undertakings made up to 31 December 2005 each year; the group profit and loss account includes the results of all subsidiary undertakings for the period from the date of their acquisition and up to the date of disposal.

Turnover and profits arising on trading between group companies are excluded.

1.3. Turnover

Turnover represents the total invoice value, excluding value added tax, of sales made during the year.

1.4. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Improvements to premises -

Straight line over the life of the lease

Fixtures, fittings

and equipment

33% Straight line

Motor vehicles

- 25% Straight line

1.5. Leasing and hire purchase commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible assets and depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce constant periodic rates of charge on the net obligations outstanding in each period.

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

1.6. Stock and work in progress

Stock and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.7. Pensions

The group operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Pension costs are charged to the profit and loss account in the year in which they arise.

1.8. Foreign currencies

Group

The financial statements of overseas subsidiary undertakings are translated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. The exchange differences arising on the re-translation of opening net assets is taken directly to reserves.

Company

Assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange prevailing at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the date of the transactions. All differences are taken to the Profit and Loss Account.
