Object

To promote religion in accordance with the Roman Catholic faith and in particular to form young men and adults to the presbyterate for the new evangelisation and for that purpose to establish a House of Formation (*Memorandum of Association*, §3²).

Activities

The Company is occupying property known as St. Edward's Convent, situated at 11 Harewood Avenue, London NW1 6LD, where 14 seminarians from a number of countries of Europe and America have been residing full board, while attending courses of philosophy and theology in preparation for the priesthood.

Students have been working in adult catechesis in India, Kazakhstan, Siberia, Cuba and West Indies, in Ireland and in Italy. In London they have carried out various pastoral ministries in parishes and schools.

During this period the Company has provided the beneficiaries with food and lodging, met their expenses (studies, clothing, health care, travelling in London and abroad, etc.) and offered them a training programme based on several activities including studies, pastoral and spiritual meetings and field-work training in the UK and abroad.

The House of Formation is run under the direct supervision and responsibility of Fr Francesco Donega, Rector of the House and Chairman of both the Administrative and the Pastoral Council. Administrative work is carried out mainly by other members of the Administrative Council. Activities like cleaning, cooking and maintenance depend on the service of voluntary helpers. A caretaker has been employed since February 1996, together with his wife.

The plan for the immediate future is to continue running the House for the academic year 2003-2004, providing the students attached to it with all that is required for their studies, pastoral activities and field-work training in UK and abroad.

Negotiations with the Archbishop of Westminster are to continue, to better define the role of the Redemptoris Mater House of Formation in the framework of the planned rearrangement of the seminaries in England and Wales.

The Sisters of Mercy, who own the Convent at 11 Harewood Avenue NW1 6LD where the House of Formation is located, have manifested the intention of selling and have put the property on the market. No time scale has been established as yet, but RMHF has started examining possibilities for the future, including relocation.

Finances

The funds made available to the Charity during the year 2002-2003 have come from unrestricted voluntary donations.

Charity funds have been used exclusively for:

- (a) covering the maintenance costs for the House (rent, electricity, gas, water, telephone, repairs, etc.);
- (b) paying for food, travel, studies and any other expenses necessary to provide the required training and ensure adequate living conditions for the beneficiaries;

- (c) paying travel expenses for the students involved in missionary work abroad;
- (d) providing food for the voluntary helpers (the Rector and two/three others) who have been living full time in the House for the sole purpose of running it in accordance with the charitable object of the Company;
- (e) none of the Directors or Members was remunerated. £107 has been spent for the Charity's management, which includes meeting expenses, travelling, stationery, administration fees and telephone calls.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO REDEMPTORIS MATER HOUSE OF FORMATION

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 August 2003 set out on pages 5 to 8.

Notes to the Accounts for the year ended on 31 August 2003

1. Accounting Policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in October 2002 ("SORP") and with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002) under the historical cost convention, modified by the revaluation of investments.

a) Donations

Donations received for the general purposes of the Charity are included as unrestricted funds. Donations for activities restricted by the wishes of the donor are taken as restricted funds.

The increase in assets of the Company is due to a donation of a motor car (estimated value £2050)

b) Resources Expended

These are accounted for on an accrual basis.

c) Depreciation

Depreciation of Motor Vehicles is provided at a rate of 25% per annum on a reducing balance basis calculated to write off the cost of the asset after its estimated useful economic life.

2. Accruals

Accruals include:

- £15000 for 3 Insurance bills not yet received.
- £1600 allocated to settle an outstanding bill for water consumption. Thames Water, our supplier, because of problems with their computer system did not charge us between 20/12/1996 and 2/8/2000. When Thames Water eventually produced a bill, by mutual agreement we undertook to pay the arrears by monthly instalments. In the meantime we were in dispute over the accuracy of our water charges subsequent to 1998, when a new building was added to the adjoining school. In January 2004 Thames Water eventually completed the installation of independent meters for the school building and we hope that they will soon be able to produce an accurate bill, which will enable us to settle the accounts. In our estimate our outstanding debt amounts to £1600.
