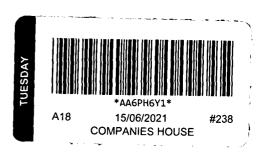

COVID-19

On 11th March 2020 the World Health Organisation declared the emergence and proliferation of COVID-19 to be a pandemic.

Due to the non-trading activities of the Company, the Directors do not expect a significant impact on the results of operations or financial condition of the Company in the short term.

Going concern

The Directors believe that preparing the financial statements on the going concern basis is appropriate. The Directors have assessed the potential impact that the global outbreak of COVID-19 has had on the liquidity, performance and financial position of the Company for at least the next 12 months.

As the company is no longer trading, the impact of COVID-19 is negligible and does not affect the the Company's abilities to meet its liabilities as they fall due. The Company is expected to remain non-trading for the foreseeable future.

Statement of Directors' responsibilities

The Directors are responsible for preparing the Annual Report including the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the Directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the Directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law), including FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland'. Under Company law the Directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company and of the profit or loss of the Company for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the Directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK accounting standards, have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue in business.

The Directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

.Directors' duty to promote the success of the Company

The Directors of the Company, as those of all UK companies, must act in accordance with section 172 of the UK Companies Act 2006. The Directors are of the opinion that they have acted fairly and in good faith to promote the success of the Company for the benefits of its members.

The Directors have carried out these duties and have made decisions and undertaken short and long term strategies to maintain its financial performance and position. As stated on page 1, this company does not trade. The Directors continue to recognise the importance of maintaining its high standards of business conduct and reputation.

1 Presentation of the financial statements

General information

The Company's business activities, future developments and a review of its performance and position are set out in the Directors' report on Pages 1-2.

The Company is a private Company, limited by shares and is incorporated in the United Kingdom under the Companies Act 2006. The Company is registered in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is Sea Containers House, 18 Upper Ground, London SE1 9GL United Kingdom.

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

2.01 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 100 'Application of Financial Reporting Requirements' ("FRS 100") and Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland' ("FRS 102").

These financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006.

Disclosure exemptions adopted

In preparing these financial statements the Company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions conferred by FRS 102:

- The requirement to prepare a statement of cash flows under FRS 201 paragraph 1.12(b) on the basis that it is a qualifying entity and its parent company, Advantage Smollan Limited, includes the Company's cash flows in its own consolidated financial statements; and
- The requirement to disclose key management personnel conpensation in total under FRS 102 paragraph 33.7; and
- The requirement to disclose certain financial instruments under FRS 102 paragraphs 11.39-11.48A and 12.26 12.29 as this information is provided assets and liabilities);

2.02 Ultimate and immediate parent undertaking

The Company's immediate parent is Headcount Worldwide Field Marketing Limited, incorporated in the United Kingdom. The ultimate parent is Karman Topco L.P., a limited partnership formed in Delaware, USA.

Advantage Smollan Limited is the parent of both the smallest group and the largest UK group which includes the Company in its consolidated financial statements. The largest group to consolidate these financial statements is Advantage Solutions Inc., a company incorporated in Delaware, USA.
