DIRECTORS REPORT

The directors submit their report and the financial statements of the Charity for the year ended 31 March 2000

RESULTS FOR YEAR

The gross income for the year totalled £167,597. The accounts show a surplus for the year of £18,119 compared to a deficit of £15,540 1n 1998/99. The surplus to carry forward is £12,204. The creditors figure of £57,292 includes £11,903 for approved grants not yet taken up and £34,816 income received in advance.

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

The company's principal activity during the year was that of the promotion and development of the arts in East Cambridgeshire.

Under the auspices of ADeC, the development of the arts in East Cambridgeshire continues to progress with grants and guarantees awarded to a wide variety of art forms in the District.

The year has been one of consolidation, and preparation for the major changes and events taking place in 2000/2001.

The Directors consider the state of the Company to be eminently satisfactory and look to the future with confidence.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS AND EVENTS SINCE THE END OF THE YEAR

The directors report that ADeC is at the start of a period of rapid change in its operations which will have a marked impact on the financial activities of the company.

A change of strategy at Council level has involved the advancement of plans to create a new art gallery and headquarters for ADeC to which the company moved in April 2000.

During 2000/2001 there are plans to implement enhancement to a network of venues throughout the District and to set up a loan bank of equipment.

Major events in 2000/2001 include the Royal Shakespeare Company's visit to Littleport in May and a series of 3 Millennium concerts in Ely Cathedral and associated education projects

Accounting convention and standards

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with applicable statements of standard accounting practice and financial reporting standards.

Incoming Resources

Incoming Resources represents income derived by direct grants from East Cambridgeshire District Council and others, subscriptions, box office and miscellaneous sales and is stated net of value added tax.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset over its estimated useful life as follows:

Fixtures and fittings

15% per annum on the reducing balance

Taxation

The company, as a charity is not liable for assessment to tax on its results.

Leasing and hire purchase commitments

Rentals paid under operating agreements are charged to income as incurred.
