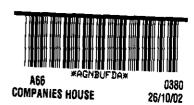

Review of Business

2001/2002 has proved to be another busy year for the Trust. The extra curricular activities have been able to expand due to the Trust paying for the school to remain open after the core school hours. Over 500 adults every week use the sports facilities on a regular basis and there are also programmes during half terms and over the summer holidays.

The trustees are very grateful to the Principal and governors of George Green's School for allowing us to operate from the school premises and sharing the post of Island Sports Trust/Community Manager. It is only by having the spirit of co-operation between the School and Trust that enables the local community and local businesses to benefit from the use of these sports facilities.

The Trustees are aware that the all weather pitch will need to be replaced in the future at a cost of £200,000. We are therefore creating a savings account (please see page 7 - high interest account) most of which will be a reserve fund to apply for match funding from the lottery and/or others in the future.

The trustees continue to be grateful for the work undertaken by the Community Manager, Stella Bailey; her contribution to the project is invaluable.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

AT 31 MARCH 2002

1. STATUS OF THE COMPANY

The company is limited by guarantee of the trustees. In terms of paragraph 7 of the Memorandum of Association, every director of the company is liable to contribute, in the event of a winding up, such amount as may be required but not exceeding £10.

2. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting.

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 2 (SORP 2).

3. TAXATION

No provision for corporation tax has been provided as the company has sought exemption on the grounds of its charitable status.

4. INTEREST RECEIVED

Interest is accounted for on the basis of cash received.

5. OPERATIONAL EXPENSES

The payments of the operational expenses are mainly undertaken by the London Borough of Tower Hamlets on behalf of the Trust on a re-imbursement basis.

6. DIRECTORS, EMPLOYEES AND STAFF COSTS

There were no employees of the Trust during the year (2001 - Nil). The directors are not employed by the company and receive no remuneration for their services to it - see also paragraph 5 above.
