NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2005

1. CHARITABLE STATUS

The company is a registered charity under the Charities Act 1993 and is accordingly exempt from taxation on its charitable activities.

2. LIABILITIES OF MEMBERS

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and has no share capital. The Memorandum and Articles of association provide that every member is liable to contribute a sum not exceeding £1 in the event of the company being wound up while he is a member of within one year of ceasing to be a member.

3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2000) issued in October 2000, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 1985. The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

Incoming Resources

income is recognised in the period in which the charitable company is entitled to receipt and the amount can be measured with reasonable certainty. Income is deferred only when the charity has to fulfil conditions before becoming entitled to it or where the donor has specified that the income is to be expended in a future period.

Investment income is included in the SOFA in the year in which it is receivable.

Expenditure

All expenditure in included on an accruals basis and is recognised when there is a legal obligation to pay for expenditure. All costs have been directly attributable to one of the functional categories of resources expended in the SOFA. The charitable company is not registered for VAT and accordingly expenditure is shown gross of irrecoverable VAT.

Stocks

No account has been taken of stocks of publications or stationery.

Leased Assets

Rental costs arising under operating leases are charged to the Income and Expenditure account in the year to which they relate.
