### DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 2 OCTOBER 2004

The directors submit herewith their annual report and the audited financial statements for the 53 weeks ended 2 October 2004.

The accounting reference date of the company is 30 September and financial statements are drawn up to a Saturday within seven days of that date. As such, these financial statements are drawn up to 2 October 2004 as permitted under Section 223 of the Companies Act 1985.

#### PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of the company is the distribution and delivery of premium parcel services.

### RESULTS FOR THE YEAR

The results for the year are set out on page 5 of the financial statements and show an operating loss of £412,000 (2003 - loss £25,000) on turnover of £9,608,000 (2003 - £10,931,000).

The directors do not recommend the payment of a final dividend on the ordinary shares of £1 each.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - 2 OCTOBER 2004

### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### (1) Basis of preparation of the financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

### (2) Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rate applicable at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are translated at period-end rates of exchange. All exchange differences thus arising are dealt with through the profit and loss account for the period.

### (3) Turnover

. .

Turnover represents the amounts (excluding value added tax) derived from the provision of goods and services to third party customers in the UK during the year.

### (4) Pensions

The company participates in the Red Star shared cost section of the Railways Pension Scheme, which provides benefits based on final pensionable pay. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. Contributions to the scheme are charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the cost of pensions over employees' working lives with the company. Further details are shown in note 17.

### (5) Deferred taxation

In accordance with FRS19 'Deferred tax', deferred taxation is provided on timing differences, arising from the different treatment for accounts and taxation purposes of events and transactions recognised in the financial statements of the current and previous years. Deferred taxation is calculated at the rates at which it is estimated that taxation will arise.

Deferred taxation assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits against which the deferred tax asset can be recovered in future years.

### (6) Cash flow statement

The Company is exempt from the requirement of Financial Reporting Standard 1 (Revised 1996) to prepare a cash flow statement, as its cash flows are included within the consolidated cashflow statement of LYNX Express Limited, a company registered in England.

#### (7) Going concern

The directors of the ultimate parent undertaking have indicated that it is their present intention to continue to support the company in meeting its external liabilities.

### (8) Related party transactions

The company has taken advantage of the exemption not to disclose related party transactions with other members of the group under Financial Reporting Standard No. 8 (Related Party Disclosures) as it is a wholly owned subsidiary

### (9) Leases

Where assets are financed by leasing agreements which give risks and rewards approximating to ownership (finance leases) they are treated as if they had been purchased outright on credit. They are therefore initially recorded as a fixed asset and a liability at a sum equal to the fair value of the asset. Leasing payments on such assets are regarded as consisting of a capital element, which reduces the outstanding liability, and an interest charge (calculated using the sum of digits method). All other leases are regarded as operating leases and the total rentals made under them are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

The RPS was established on 31 May 1994 by the Railways Pension Scheme Order 1994 (SI 1994/1433). The RPS provides benefits based on final average pensionable pay. The assets of the RPS are held separately from those of the company. Following the closure of the Red Star rail operation on 25 May 2001 the number of active employees within this scheme is minimal and consequently FRS17 disclosures for the scheme are consolidated within the financial statements of the ultimate parent company, Lynx Express Limited.

The net pension charge for the year amounted to £26,000 (2003 - £21,000).
