The trustees present their annual report and accounts for the year ended 31st March 2013. The board of trustees are satisfied with the performance of the charity during the year and the position at 31st March 2013 and consider that the charity is in a strong position to continue its activities during the coming year, and that the charity's assets are adequate to fulfil its obligations.

Name, registered office and constitution of the charity

The full name of the charity is Relate London North West. The charity was previously known by the name Relate Central Middlesex.

Objectives and activities of the charity

A summary of the objects of the charity as set out in its governing document

The charitable company exists to promote better relationships between couples and families living in the London Boroughs of Barnet, Brent, Ealing, Harrow and Hillingdon The charity operates in the areas of Counselling, Mediation, Psychosexual Therapy and Education

An explanation of the charity's main aims and objectives for the year

The charity's main objective for the year was to promote the objects set out in its governing document and to provide such further related services that will enhance the range and effectiveness of those objectives

An explanation of the charity's strategies for achieving its stated objectives

The charity works within a framework set out by the Relate Federation and in accordance with the strategy set out in its own business plan

Details of significant activities (including its main programmes, projects, or services provided) that contribute to the achievement of the stated objectives

The Charity's services are in three main areas

- 1 Counselling couple counselling, family counselling and psychosexual therapy. It also runs a child contact centre
- 2 Mediation family mediation and housing mediation
- 3 Education -peer listening for schools and courses for individuals

The charity's grant making policies

The charity does not make grants

Social or programme-related investment

There is no programme-related investment

The contribution of volunteers

The charity has some counselling practitioners who work in a purely voluntary capacity

Summary of main activities of the charity in relation to its objects

The organisation has its principal office in Harrow but also provides services from rooms in Barnet, Brent, Ealing and Hillingdon

The services provided focus on families and relationships at all stages of life and are as follows

Adult Relationship counselling

For couples or individuals who experience difficulties in their adult relationships. Clients are seen for an initial assessment session of 1 hour. Following on from this they usually attend 50 minute counselling sessions, over a period of weeks.

Psychosexual therapy

For individuals or couples for whom the main identified problem is a sexual one. The programme aims to help the individual or couple relearn more satisfying sexual behaviour and to develop a mutual sense of confidence and enjoyment in love-making.

Family mediation

This is for people who are separating or divorcing. They are able to talk through issues affecting their children, financial arrangements and property. The company also offers other conflict resolution services such as neighbourhood and workplace mediation.

Education and training services

This offers education and training to young people and adults through workshops and peer listening projects in schools

Family counselling

This is a service for people who wish to attend as a family group. Clients are seen together or separately for sessions of varying lengths, as agreed with the counsellor, to work through issues that are affecting their family and other relationships.

The charitable company acts in accordance with its business plan, which is reviewed by the management committee on a regular basis

Achievements and Performance of the Charity

A review of charitable activities and main achievements undertaken by the charity

Relationship counselling for 2,256 people for a total of 8,428 hours

Family counselling for 173 families

Children and young people's counselling 67 young people between the ages of 11 and 18 years

Psychosexual therapy for 149 people

Family mediation for 717 people

Housing mediation for 138 people

Life skills workshops for 153 people over 19 courses

Peer listening Programme training for 71 young people over 3 courses

Uxbridge Child Contact Centre has enabled contact for 48 families where there is a non-resident parent

Separated Parents Information Programme for 192 individuals over 30 programmes

Fundraising activities

Charges are made for the provision of counselling and psychosexual therapy services based on the clients' income and their ability to pay. Four of the local authorities provide grants, which assisted the charitable company to provide services to those clients who cannot afford to pay either all or part of the charge.

Family mediation is funded by the Legal Services Commission in the case of clients who attract public funding and by private clients according to incomes Housing Mediation is funded by 2 local authorities

The education and training department charges fees for its work

Client Contributions

Most clients pay their contributions by cheque or credit card. A very small number of clients pay their contributions in cash directly to the counsellor. A receipt is issued by the counsellor and the money is deposited by the bookkeeper the next day. The counsellor gets the receipt signed by the client to verify the amount taken.

Investment performance achieved against investment objectives set

In the financial review section of this report there is a description of the investment policies and objectives established by the trustees and the extent to which social environmental or ethical considerations are taken into account

The investment performance achieved against the objectives set was within the projections made by the Trustees

Factors relevant to the achievement of the charity's objectives

The charity receives grants from four Local Authorities which enables it to provide counselling services to residents in those boroughs at below its actual cost The provision of these subsidised services is dependent on the continuation of the existing grants

Employment of disabled persons

The charity is an equal opportunity employer and offers employment to disabled persons on equal terms

Structure, Governance and Management

Nature of the Governing Document and constitution of the charity

The charity is governed by its Memorandum of Understanding and Articles of Association, and its membership agreement with the Relate Federation

The methods adopted for the recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Some trustees are nominated by two of the Local Authorities serviced by the charity or recommended by other Trustees The charity also advertises amongst its members and local community and through Reach

The policies and procedures adopted for the induction and training of trustees

Trustees are given relevant literature on appointment and attend an induction meeting with the Chair and the Chief Executive (Company Secretary)

The organisational structure of the charity and how decisions are made

The Board of Trustees meets four times each year. The Management Sub- Committee which consists of the Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer, Chief Executive and two employee representatives meets bi-monthly and takes decisions on the management of the charity, reporting to the Trustees The trustees will make any policy decisions. The Chief Executive runs the charity on a day to day basis reporting to the Management Sub-Committee and consulting with its members as necessary.

Relationships between the charity and related parties, including its subsidiaries

The company does not enter into any transactions with related parties

The major risks to which the charity is exposed and reviews and systems to mitigate risks

The management committee have conducted their own review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed and systems have been established to mitigate those risks, as far as is practicable. Internal risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions and projects and to ensure consistent quality of delivery for all operational aspects of the charitable company. These procedures are periodically reviewed by the Trustees to ensure that they still meet the needs of the charity.

Relationships with other groups, charities and individuals

The charity works closely with other members of the Relate Federation and with related government agencies, charities and local community groups

Financial Review

Policies on reserves

The unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible assets amounted to £239,552 (2012 - £227,324)

The management committee feels that it would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in funding by restricting the amount of non-chargeable or subsidised services supplied

The designated fund arose from the accumulation of funds for the purpose of the purchase, maintenance or improvement of premises. Designated funds can be used to ringfence sums for specific uses in future periods.

The management committee would like to increase the level of unrestricted funds and is considering ways of achieving this

Principal funding sources and how expenditure in the year under review has supported the key objectives of the charity

The London Boroughs of Brent, Harrow, Hillingdon and Ealing have part- funded counselling through grant aid for core services. The housing departments of Brent and Harrow have also funded housing mediation. The Legal Services Commission has part-funded the Family Mediation Service Other funding is through client payments according to their ability to pay

The investment policy and objectives, including the extent (if any) to which social, environmental or ethical considerations are taken into account

The management committee have considered the most appropriate policy for investing funds and have found long-term fixed deposits meet their requirements. They consider the return on investments in the year to be satisfactory

Availability and adequacy of assets of each of the funds

The financial statements are set out on pages 14 to 26. The financial statements have been prepared implementing the 2005 Revision of the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued by the Charity Commission for England and Wales (effective April 2005) and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008). As stated in the introduction to this report, the trustees consider the financial performance by the charity during the year to have been satisfactory.

The Statement of Financial Activities show net incoming resources for the year of a revenue nature of £1,815 and no realised resources of a capital nature, making net overall increase in resources of £1,815

The total reserves at the year end stand at £431,090 (2012 £429,276)

A majority of the expenditure is spent on salaries, both for counsellors and management and administration

The additions to fixed assets are computer and other office equipment costing £6,794

Share Capital

The company is limited by guarantee and therefore has no share capital

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2013

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)', issued in March 2005, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and the Companies Act 2006

Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity

Restricted funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose

Designated funds are unrestricted funds set aside at the discretion of the trustees for specific purposes

Further details of each fund are disclosed in note 17

Incoming resources

Voluntary income including donations and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability

Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis

Income from charitable activities includes income recognised as earned (as the related goods or services are provided) under contract

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Costs of generating funds are the costs associated with attracting voluntary income

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them

Governance costs

Governance costs include costs of the preparation and examination of the statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and the cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters

Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, for example, allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage

Irrecoverable VAT

Irrecoverable VAT is charged against the category of resources expended for which it was incurred

Fixed assets

Individual fixed assets costing £250 or more are initially recorded at cost

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows

25% straight line basis

Pensions

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions are charged in the statement of financial activities as they become payable in accordance with the rules of the scheme.
